Germany has committed to fund the expansion of the Olkaria Geothermal Station to increase its capacity. The support comes at a time when Kenya is on its way to achieving a 100 per cent clean energy grid. This was disclosed at a media briefing on Friday at the State House in Nairobi after President William Ruto held bilateral talks with Chancellor of Germany Olaf Scholz.

The leaders committed to working together in the implementation of the Paris Agreement by leading Kenya to join the Climate Club.

They also exchanged views on the modalities of increasing the capacity of Kenya’s TVETs and the export of skilled workforce to Germany.

President Ruto urged Chancellor Scholz to review and ease immigration laws to enable Kenyans find employment in Germany.

“We have agreed to establish a technical team to expeditiously formulate an appropriate framework for the export of labour to Germany.”

The Head of State noted that he had

also called on the Chancellor to review the tariff barriers to allow Kenyan products to enter the German as well as the European market.

Germany, the President added, had agreed to support Kenya’s efforts to conclude negotiation of the Economic Partnership Agreement between the East African Community and the European Union on the principle of variable geometry.

Kenya and Germany further agreed to finalise a framework of exchange programmes between their small and

medium-sized enterprises.

“What we seek is synergy, cross-pollination and other complementarities to enrich learning and grow the economy from the bottom going up,” President Ruto added.

Chancellor Scholz committed to extend financial and technical support to the African Climate Action Summit that Nairobi will host in September.

though they made immense contributions to the birth of the country.

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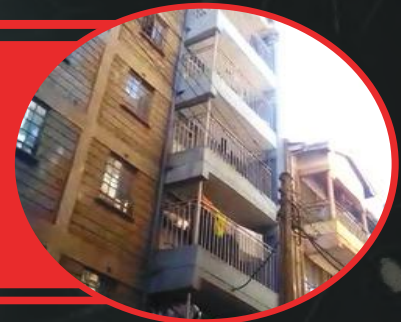

250,000 Jobs Open For Kenyans In Germany

The good ties between Kenya and Germany went a notch higher with the State Visit of Chancellor Olaf Scholz on Thursday. At a bilateral meeting and a press conference at State House Nairobi, President William Ruto called for the easing of immigration barriers so that Kenyans can access job opportunities in the European country.

Consequently, the Chancellor agreed to open doors to 250,000 professional, skilled and semi-skilled Kenyans in an effort to meet Germany’s huge labour requirements. The two leaders also agreed on the need for the world to work in concert in mitigating the effects of climate change. President Ruto said the discussions in this critical matter must not be limited to “adaptation, loss and damage; indeed, they must include climate financing, climate trading and climate

investment”. To ensure that Africa’s voice on the climate issue is heard loud and clear, President Ruto explained that he will host the African Climate Action Summit between September 4 and 6 in Nairobi. “This will enable the continent’s leaders and experts consolidate Africa’s position ahead of COP28,” he said. In response, Chancellor Scholz committed to extend financial and technical support to the summit.

The joint bi-partisan team, tasked with negotiations between Azimio La Umoja and Kenya Kwanza Alliance, is yet to reach a consensus on the thorny issues before formal talks can commence.

Rarieda MP Otiende Amollo and his Tharaka counterpart George Murugara, who co-chair the team, said they were set to reach a consensus on the matters in the week commencing May 8, 2023.

The opposing sides are yet to agree on the framework of issues to be discussed and the process of formalization.

“We wish to report that on those two issues, we have made tremendous progress and it’s a work in progress. We haven’t finalized but we will finalize early next week,” said Amollo.

The Azimio Coalition is pushing for talks focusing on four areas, including the high cost of living and the reinstatement of the Cherera Four.

The Kenya Kwanza Alliance wants

talks to revolve around the reconstitution of the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC).

The team has not agreed on whether the talks will be parliamentary or ex-parliamentary, hindering the commencement of formal talks.

“We are going to explore whether the talks will be parliamentary, ex parliamentary or through an executive order. We will engage come next week back to back,” Amollo noted.

The team, which has expressed goodwill, is also yet to agree on the timeline for concluding formal talks.

“We will have to look at the best of the timelines and the amount of work that should be done. It’s important we give it the commitment it deserves so fact Kenyans can get what they deserve,” said Murugara.

This comes even as they formally appointed Azimio’s Paul Mwangi and Kenya Kwanza’s Muthomi Thiankolu as joint Secretaries.

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The ruling coalition announced on Wednesday that it had replaced Keynan with Diddo Raso, moments after the Azimio coalition issued a statement saying it is ready to call off planned protests.

“We appreciate the statement by Azimio on the resumption of talks. We appreciate the reconciliation tone from Azimio,” said Kimani Ichungwah, the Majority Leader in the National Assembly in a joint statement with his Senate counterpart Aaron Cheruiyot.

“We have consulted with Keynan and he has agreed to recuse himself so that we make progress,” they said, “We have agreed to nominate Diddo Rasso so that these talks can continue.”

A statement issued earlier by Azimio and which was signed by Wiper party leader Kalonzo Musyoka states that the coalition was ready

to call off protests if only Keynan is replaced.

“This was the offer I made on Sunday,” Kalonzo said, “all our other conditions remain the same.” The coalition was yet to officially call off the protests set for Thursday by the time this article was published.

The Raila Odinga-led coalition has been holding protests over the high cost of living and alleged electoral fraud and had vowed to resume demonstrations on Thursday unless their demands are addressed.

Key on the demand was the replacement of Keynan, whom they said belongs to their coalition and cannot therefore negotiate for Kenya Kwanza which he “purports to have joined.”

Odinga narrowly lost to President William Ruto — his fifth presidential election defeat — and continues to insist that the poll was fraudulent and that victory was “stolen”.

Kuria said Mukami and Dedan's legacies must be institutionalised, describing her as a symbol of patriotism and valour.

State To Issue Same-Day Birth And Death Certificates

Citizens who apply for birth and death certificates will now receive the documents on the same day of application, the government has announced.

Immigration and Citizen Services PS Julius Bitok said the directive that takes effect immediately was part of the reforms being undertaken to clear the backlog of pending applications and to pre-empt frustrations experienced by applicants forced to endure long waits for their documents.

The PS who was speaking in Meru County during the opening of the Civil Registration Services office for the South Imenti sub-county in Nku-bu, said the countrywide fast-tracking of the issuance of the certificates is also targeted at encouraging higher levels of registration.

“I am directing all registration of-

ficers to ensure every person who walks into our offices leaves with the document on the same day. We are doing this so that, as a country, we can officially record more deaths than the 55% that is the current rate," he said.

He appealed to chiefs and their assistants and the public to ensure every death is promptly reported to the relevant government offices saying unreported cases posed a threat to effective succession within families whenever death occurs and encour-

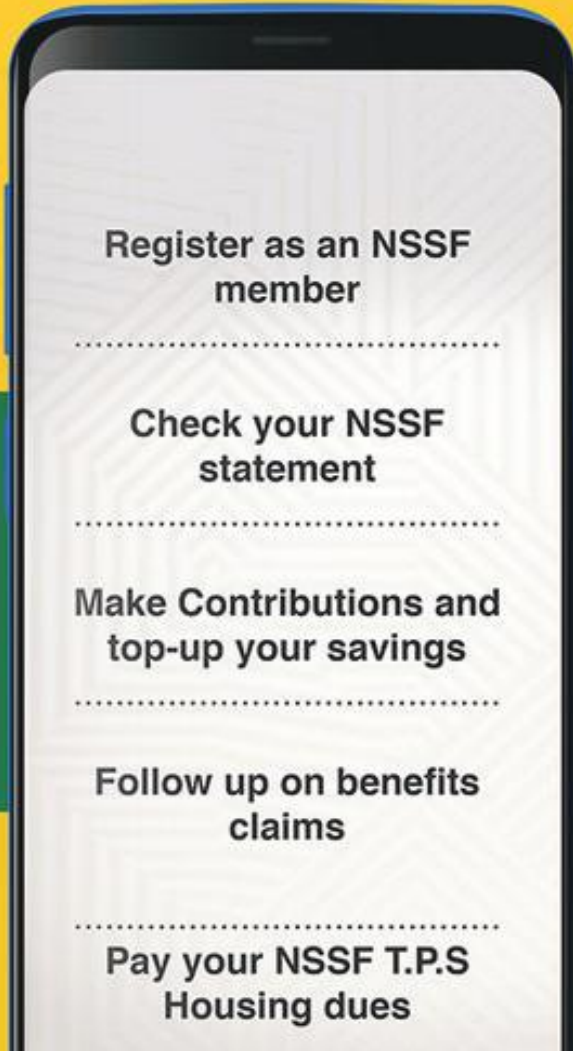
aged criminal acts such as fraud and impersonation.

“What it means when 45 out of every 100 deaths are not registered is that families may not be able to inherit property of a deceased. In other cases, you will have dead people

voting and doing other illegalities.” He urged residents to take advantage of the new offices to acquire birth certificates that are a mandatory requirement for enrolment in schools and issuance of subsequent identification documents such as Identity Cards (IDs) and passports. Currently, the national average for birth registration is around 87pc. The PS who also opened another Civil Registration Services in Tigania West sub-county in Mikinduri within Meru said more offices will be opened across the country to make it easier for residents to access vital documents.

The opening of the two offices brings to six the number of CSR offices serving the more than 1.5 million population in Meru County.

The events were attended by local leaders including MPs: Shadrack Mwiti (Imenti South), Moses Kirima (Imenti Central), Mpuru Ampuri (Tigania West), John Mwirigi (Igembe South), Dorothy Ikiara (Nominated).

When she was battling multiple health complications largely associated with her advanced age, Ms Mukami Kimathi, the wife of the freedom fighter Field Marshal Dedan Kimathi Wachiuri, had one main wish to the leaders in the current and previous governments of Kenya who used to flock her home or hospital to wish her a quick recovery.

My wish is to see the remains of my husband and have an opportunity to give him a decent burial.

Therefore, I plead with you to help me to locate and identify the grave where he was buried by the oppressive and brutal colonial authorities and exhume his remains.

I can see my days on the earth are drawing closer. So, help me realize my wish before I die. She would utter these words even when she was in great pain.

As it turned out, she has left us before the efforts by the Kenya Kwanza Government to locate the grave of her husband bore the fruits.

Ms Mukami and her family had been seeking similar interventions from the previous governments.

President Mwai Kibaki and his successor Uhuru Kenyatta had shown some goodwill but thier efforts also hit a dead end.

For the current administration, the pronouncements by President William Ruto and his Deputy President Rigathi left no doubt it was taking this matter seriously.

We want to know where Kimathi was buried.

We have even written a petition to our former colonial master (British Government).

They owe us an explanation and we are demanding that they should show us this grave.

Going by narrations of the historians, this is story of how Kimathi met his death in 1957.

He was first captured by British soldiers while in the Abardares forest and this happened soon after he held a meeting with Mau Mau fighters.

Being the face of struggle, he was their main target. The soldiers however knew they were dealing with a dangerous person.

So, the first move was immobilizing him so they can disarm him. They first shot him in the leg and this enabled to capture him while alive and ferried him to Kamiti Maximum Prison.

Sometimes back, some media reports had indicated there was a person assigned the work of washing and cleaning his wounds.

This showed he was not killed immediately.

There were unconfirmed reports that the British Colonial Authorities wanted to first consult one of the prominent Kenyan leader who happened to be a key rival of Kimathi.

Two bulls cannot be put in same pen. He reportedly responded when he was asked whether the Field Marshal should be eliminated.

As it would later emerge, there was on record whether he was buried within Kamiti prison land.

His killing was treated as top level secret. This created the room for speculations.

Some reports would allege. The colonial authorities chopped his head and flown it to UK where it was put in their archives.

He had few weeks earlier visited her at the hospital here in Nairobi and announced that President Ruto would clear her medical bill of Sh4 million.

For starters, Mukami was a freedom fighter. Apart from taking care of her husband, the leader of the movement, she played a key role of ferrying the guns used by the fighters for service and returning the firearms back to them.

These are guns they had snatched the colonial soldiers. This after abducting, killing and subduing some of them. At a time, the Mau Mau

raided their camps.

She also used to sneak and supply food and arms to the fighters in the caves and other designated hide-outs of the forest where the fighters would congregate to eat the food.

She worked together with other battle-hardened women.

Some of them used to escape death narrowly while others paid ultimate price.

The British soldiers had identified them as a key pillar in this war.

So, they had crafted a strategy of annihilating them. They would not spare them when they met and spotted them.

These women had learnt the art of dodging bullets and taking cover.

For others, they would trick the soldiers by pretending to befriend them. They would later escape after engaging them in a 'lovely chat'.

This explains why many survived.

As I conclude, let me say this to Mukami. Maitu, you fought a good battle and you will be remembered forever. Rest, Maitu, Rest In Peace.

Committee On Finance And National Planning Meets CRA Over Revenue Sharing Formula

The Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning is currently holding a two day Familiarization retreat with the Commission on Revenue Allocation in Serena Hotel Mombasa County.

The retreat which took off yesterday saw the Commission through its Vice Chair Koitamet Ole Kina take the Committee through its mandate, roles and their programs The Commission informed the lawmakers that when developing the revenue allocation recommendations for national and county governments, the Commission looks at the performance of the economy, which includes gross domestic product (GDP), inflation, interest rates, and exchange rates.

In addition, the Commission examines the country’s fiscal performance, which includes the total revenue collected nationally, royalties

from mining, government expenditure, public debt, and county government finances:

On Marginalization, the Commission told the lawmakers that it recommends the following formula for sharing resources among the county governments

Population – 45%
Basic equal share – 25%
Poverty index – 20%
Land area – 8%
Fiscal responsibility – 2%

The Committee was finally appraised on the framework for the Third Revenue Sharing Basis which has has four objectives:- to enhance service development delivery, to promote balanced development, to incentivise counties to optimise capacity to raise revenue and to incentivise prudent use of public resources.

These objectives are expected to be implemented through a transfer framework that provides for three components: service delivery, balanced development, and incentive. The retreat will continue tomorrow



where the Committee is expected to scrutinize the 2023/24 FY budget estimates for the Commission.

Nakuru Taps Agri-Tech To Boost Food Security, Provide Jobs

- The CECM made the remarks at the County headquarters when he hosted a delegation from Projet d'Appui à la Compétitivité des Filières Agricoles et à la Diversification des Exportations (PACOFIDE), a World Bank-funded project in Benin, that visited Nakuru for a benchmarking tour.
- Bor indicated that investments by the County government in agritech were timely as agriculture and food security in Africa have been under the pressure from many challenges such as low productivity, lack of knowledge and poor exposure to new farming techniques and limited financial support.

County Executive Committee Member (CECM) for Agriculture Mr Leonard Bor said the devolved unit had been actively promoting adoption of digital agricultural technologies as a way of enhancing productivity and profitability adding that 14,000 farmers in the region had embraced the modern technologies, particularly in response to the effects of climate change.

He added that the County government was also helping women and youthful farmers to integrate innovative technologies in crop and livestock farming to boost food production and incomes.

Bor voiced Governor Susan Kihika's commitment to address the challenges of small-holder farmers lacking technical expertise and the migration of young people from rural areas to urban areas to help increase food production in the rural areas.

"Appropriate agritech technologies such as soil testing, application of

recommended fertilizer rates per unit area, and use of certified seeds among others have been deployed in all the 11 Sub-Counties," said Bor.

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He regretted that Africa's weather was unpredictable, while its population was exploding, with the poor farming practices depleting farm soil and exacerbating deforestation and water scarcity.

Poor digital literacy in Africa and unwavering respect for traditional ways of farming were blamed for the continued food insecurity and food

importation by a majority of African countries.

Bor however said his department was promoting tech start-ups that have developed solutions targeting various aspects of agriculture, including finance, supply chain, retailing, and delivering information on crops and weeds among others which are accessible to farmers through front-end devices such as smartphones and tablets, or even SMS.

He added that agritech had also brought new financial services for farmers, covering credit, farm inputs, insurance and market access through machine learning, remote sensing, and mobile technology.

The CECM said county governments were now training farmers on best farming practices to improve production and on value addition for their produce to fetch more money and to avoid food loss and waste in addition to the counties exploring the use of digital extension services to overcome barriers and constraints faced by rural women.

The benchmarking tour was aimed at exploring opportunities for growth and partnerships for the Benin and

Kenya governments and sharing lessons on the effectiveness of an enabling environment for agri-tech startups in the county.

The team visited Bargain and Wakulima markets to learn about Kenya Agricultural Marketing Information Systems (KAMIS).

The system provides members and stakeholders with improved early warning marketing and trade information, leading to more efficient and competitive transactions in food trade between surplus and deficit regions.

The delegation also toured the Elburgon Progressive Cooperative Society Dairy plant in Elburgon ward, a beneficiary of digital agriculture technology under the National Agricultural and Rural Inclusive Growth Project (NARIGP).

Kenya, Nigeria and Ghana are top agri-tech markets in Africa accounting for over 60 per cent of start-ups that are active on the continent, according to a report by Africa's start-up portal, Disrupt Africa. The report shows that Kenya accounts for 23.2 per cent of all African agri-tech start-ups.

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Nakuru To Tap Into Satellite Technology To Map Location Data

- The technology is important for decision-making during planning and allocation of resources for the Annual Development Plan (ADP).
- Ms. Changwony noted that in Africa, geospatial technology is necessary because the continent still faces numerous challenges such as unplanned settlements, degraded rangelands, inadequate or unplanned infrastructure, low quality of development projects, poor monitoring systems, mushrooming of new settlements, and inequitable resource allocation due to a lack of appropriate tools for decision-making.
- “We have resolved to use GIS technology cognizant of these challenges and the need to streamline monitoring of development projects and ensure equitable resource allocations based on evidence,” the Chief Officer explained.

Nakuru County Government is in the process of establishing a Geographical Information System (GIS) laboratory to help the devolved unit in collection of data digitally and improve on its development.

The devolved unit’s administration has indicated that the GIS system will help in getting information on the varieties of natural resources in the county and the social facilities available adding that it will also help in management of human resources.

Chief Officer in charge of Lands Ms. Catherine Changwony elaborated that the GIS laboratory system will further help local and foreign investors to conveniently access land information.

While noting that setting up of the GIS laboratory was in line with Governor Susan Kihika’s manifesto to digitize access to some essential services to shorten the time and reduce the cost of access to services, Ms. Changwony added that the system would help them collect, process and analyze data in digital form.

She made the remarks during a training programme for county lands officials on data transformation and the establishment of a Lands Information System conducted by the Regional Centre for Mapping of Resources for Development (RCMRD).

Ms. Changwony said she was hope-

ful that the GIS laboratory system would improve development planning and management.

The GIS lab is expected to provide a platform to store and manage digital footprint of development projects in sectors such as water, education, health, roads, rangelands, environment and natural resources.

Clause 105(f) of the County Government Act 2012 requires county governments to establish GIS-based database systems for the provision of data in the development of the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP).

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“We have resolved to use GIS technology cognizant of these challenges and the need to streamline monitoring of development projects and ensure equitable resource allocations

based on evidence,” the Chief Officer explained.

GIS uses location-based data collected via satellites, paper maps, and directly from the field through mobile positioning devices to map out resources for analysis and decision-making.

The Chief Officer said the technology would help the county government support prudent management and allocation of resources while also facilitating rational decision-making processes.

She pointed out that by using geographic information, the county government will be able to make informed decisions when it comes to planning and distributing projects equitably.

“The system enables any government to make key decisions that enable development in all areas without discrimination. The Geospatial Technologies Services Laboratory stores data for all projects done by the county and also helps in monitoring projects being implemented. The technology provides the GIS with images frequently to help closely monitor ongoing development projects in the county,” she explained.

She went on, “This satellite technology will enable us to monitor our programmes and thus ensure their implementation. It is one way of automating services with the aim of

improving efficiency as well as sealing loopholes through which public funds are lost.”

The technology can identify areas in dire need of road connections or a department that requires urgent support in terms of funding, among other things.

It can also be used to enhance various social amenities such as schools, social schools, hospitals, dispensaries, and markets.

The system has also helped streamline the budgeting process and give evidence-based development needs to the people, thereby attracting support from development partners, according to the official.

Ms. Changwony said GIS will help the county administration manage resources efficiently and effectively for the benefit of the residents, including forest areas, water, minerals, wildlife, and wetlands, through developed spatial plans.

“GIS offers a clear look into issues affecting the residents and comes in handy in implementing policy frameworks and enhancing feedback. Most people may not know, but GIS and its utilization and implementation are part of Governor Kihika’s manifesto,” noted the Chief Officer.

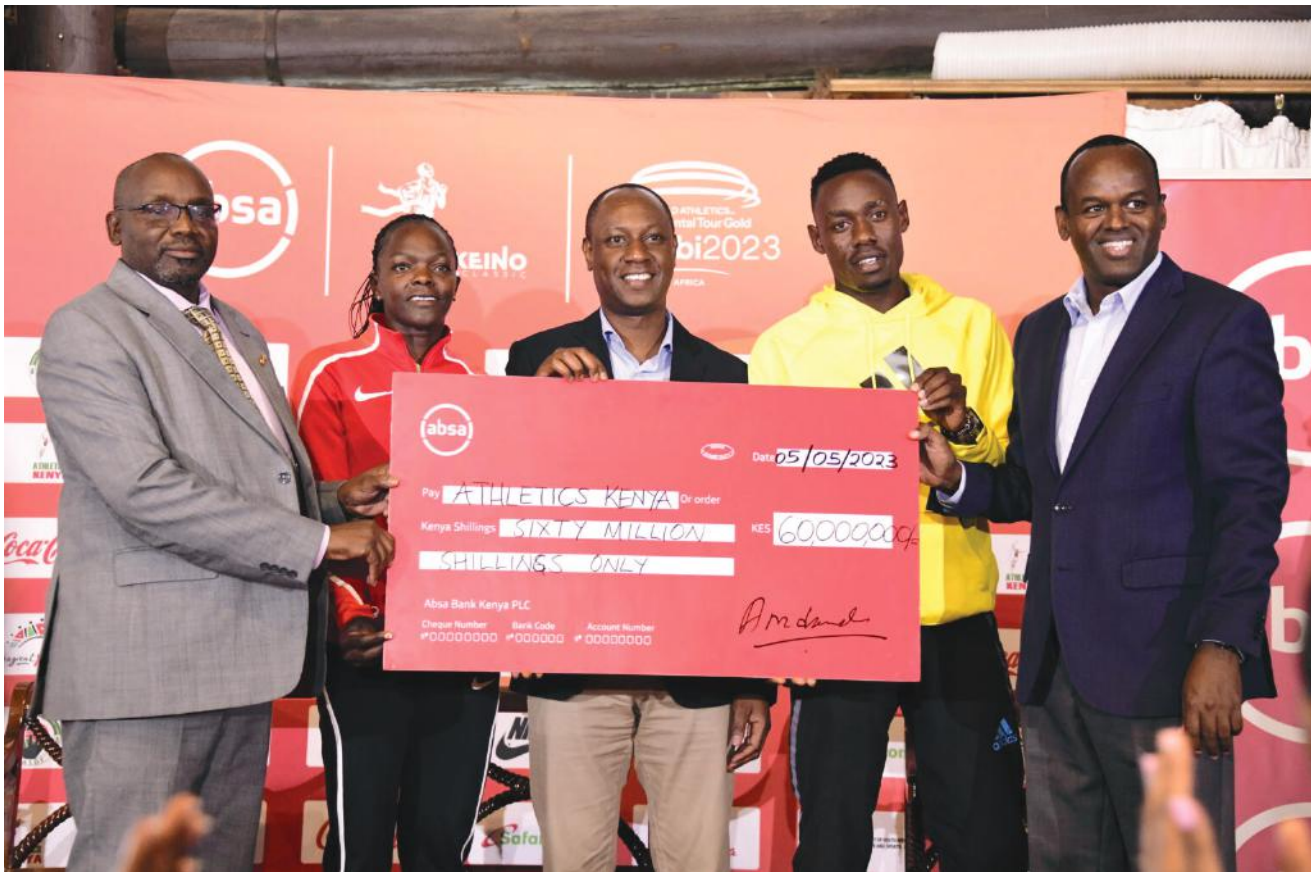

Kenya is increasingly hopeful it will soon become the second country in Africa to host a Diamond League event after Morocco.

Athletics Kenya (AK) president Jack Tuwei said they are currently negotiating with World Athletics to upgrade the Kip Keino Classic World Continental Tour Gold to a Diamond League meet.

“As we go forward, we also want to upgrade this event because we are now heading towards the fourth edition of the competition. We have applied to World Athletics to upgrade this event to a Diamond League race and things are not looking so terrible...it is being considered. There is only one Diamond League in Africa (Rabat, Morocco) and hopefully the next time we are gathered here, we will be talking about a Diamond League event,” Tuwei said.

The Diamond League is the

most prestigious track and field competition among World Athletics’ roster of one-day meets across the world.

A successor to the IAAF Golden League in 2010, the competition brings together the crème-de-la-crème of global athletes and is staged in Oslo, Doha, Shanghai, Rome, Eugene, Lausanne, Monaco, London, Zurich, Brussels, Shenzhen, Gateshead, Chorzow, Birmingham, London, New York, Paris, Rabat and Stockholm.

The World Continental Tour Gold is the second most lucrative series of one-day meetings, which was launched in 2020 and has thus far been held in various cities, such as Nairobi, Zagreb, Melbourne, Turku, St Georges and Ostrava, among others.

Kenya was one of the first countries in which this competition was held, hosting the first edition of the Kip Keino Classic at the Nyayo Stadium

in October 2020, amidst a ravaging Covid-19 pandemic that had forced the cancellation and postponement of major sporting events across the globe.

Reflecting on the growth of the competition over the years, Tuwei noted that the Kip Keino Classic continues to provide many athletes across the continent with opportunities to compete and sharpen themselves.

He expressed his desire to see Africa host more World Continental Tour events whether at gold, silver or bronze levels.

“The Botswana Grand Prix was born out of the Kip Keino Classic. We are happy to see that this event inspires other countries to host other legs of the World Continental Tour across the continent. This is what we need... to see our athletes get as many opportunities as possible to compete and put money in their pockets,” he said.

Tuwei was speaking on Friday

morning at Safari Park Hotel during the launch of the fourth edition of the one-day elite athletics meet.

Speaking at the same event, Absa Kenya CEO Abdi Mohammed said the bank remains committed to walking together and growing with the Kip Keino Classic as part of its efforts to inspire millions through sports.

“Sports is empowering and inspiring and that’s why we are excited to work with Athletics Kenya. At Absa Kenya, we are all about Africanacity, which is about finding unique ways to do things despite the challenges,” Mohammed said.

The bank will be the title sponsor for the event for the third year running and has this year pumped Ksh 60 million towards the success of the competition.

Commonwealth Games 800m champion Mary Moraa says revenge will be on her mind when she comes up against South African Prudence Sekgodiso at the fourth edition of the Kip Keino Classic at the Moi International Sports Centre Kasarani on May 13.

At last year’s edition of the same event, Sekgodiso clocked 1:58.41 to win the two-lap race in front of a partisan crowd at Kasarani.

Moraa came second in 1:59.87 as another Kenyan, Naomi Korir, timed 2:00.06 to finish third.

The world 800m bronze medalist attributed the surprise loss to not knowing about the threat

posed by the South African beforehand and assured fans she is better prepared this year.

“Last season, I wasn’t ready for the lady from South Africa (Sekgodiso) and it was like a surprise to me but this time around, I am ready and well prepared with the coaches. I have been telling them that I am going to revenge,” Moraa said.

Sekgodiso, 21, has gone from strength to strength since that win, clinching bronze at the Africa Athletics Championships in Mauritius in June before leading her country to a fourth place finish in mixed relay at February’s World Cross Country Championships in Bathurst, Australia.

Her last race was last weekend’s Botswana Grand Prix World Continental Tour where she timed 2:00.39 to finish second in the women’s 800m.

It was at the same meet that Moraa clocked a personal best of 50.44 to win the women’s 400m.

She described her feat in Gaborone as a step in the right direction as she eyes improvement in her specialty – the women’s 800m.

“I was using the 400m race to test my speed and see where I am as far as my preps for the World Championships is concerned. I enjoying running in the 400m but where my heart truly belongs is the 800 metres race,” Moraa

said.

She was in high spirits during the launch of the Kip Keino Classic Continental Tour, noting that her focus remains on building upon her bronze medal at Oregon to clinch the world title in Budapest in August this year.

“I think this year my big target is to land in the World Championship in Budapest and finish on the podium. Everybody is strong and we have only 3 medals,” she concluded.
