- At the same time, a compliance status report must be submitted by the end of August 8th by all Ministries and State Departments, along with a report on all services planned for onboarding onto the e-Citizen platform by the deadline of August 11 at 5 PM.

1,448 paybill numbers have been discontinued following a move by the government to have all payments for services done through a new single number.

Ministries, State Departments, and Agencies which had not migrated to the designated Paybill 222222 have until Tuesday, August 8 to do so.

Previously Kenyans were paying for different services through multiple pay bill numbers.

At the same time, a compliance status report must be submitted by the end of August 8th by all Ministries and State Departments, along with a report on all services planned for onboarding onto the e-Citizen platform by the deadline of August 11 at 5 PM.

According to the Principal Secretary for the State Department for Immigration and Citizen Services Prof (Amb) Julius Bitok, the move was in compliance with the Executive's further directive that all existing Paybills be discontinued in fa-

vour of the new Paybill, number.

"Government Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDA5) that are yet to comply with the directive are urged to do so without further delay," he said in a statement.

While speaking during the launch of a revamped E-Citizen portal on June 30, President Ruto regretted the government could not account for some of the PayBill numbers used by various government agencies.

The improved platform is hosting over 5,000 government services, with the number set to increase by the end of the year.

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Prof Ensign Quits As USIU VC, Council Cites Medical Reasons Tied To Kenya’s ‘Altitude’

Professor Margee Ensign has resigned as Vice Chancellor of the United States International University-Africa (USIU-Africa) University. Prof. Ensign’s resignation came barely a year after she assumed office on September 1, 2022. University Council Chairperson Kris Ole-Senanu announced her exit on Monday. Senanu cited medical reasons tied to the country’s altitude. “Prof. Ensign has been faced with personal medical challenges related to the altitude in Nairobi, and her doctors have advised her that she cannot live and work here,” he said. USIU-Africa announced Prof Ensign’s appointment of as the new substantive Vice-Chancellor on July 18, 2022. Ensign, who took over from the USIU-Africa Interim Vice Chancellor Freida Brown, served as the President of the American University of Nigeria (AUN) in Yola, where she served as President from 2010 to 2017. Speaking when he confirmed the ap-

pointment, Ole-Senanu said Ensign has an outstanding track record with a stellar academic career, including 12 years as a successful Vice-Chancellor in Nigeria and in the US, where she was a formidable ambassador and successful fund-raiser. Outstanding track record Ole-Senanu paid a glowing tribute to the outgoing Interim Vice Chancellor Brown, describing her return from her retirement stint as magnanimous facilitation that underpins her selfless service to USIU-Africa. “The University Council is confident that Prof. Ensign’s experience leading two very different organizations as Vice Chancellor will enable her to address the challenges and opportunities for USIU-Africa,” Ole-Senanu said. “She brings an undoubted commitment, passion and vision around deepening international and intercultural education in Africa: it has been at the heart of her teaching, research, publications, and administrative life, and has led her to experience working in numerous international environments including Rwanda, Ugan-

da, and Nigeria.” Prior to her AUN Vice Chancellorship, Ensign was Associate Provost for International Initiatives, Dean and Professor, School of International Studies, University of The Pacific (1999-2010), worked in Rwanda & Uganda (2003-9), and held administrative and faculty positions at Co-

lumbia and Tulane Universities. While welcoming the appointment, Prof. Ensign exuded energy and optimism and said she was looking forward to the USIU-Africa tour of duty. At USIU-Africa, Ensign said she would deploy her leadership style and experience to foster a spirit of enthusiasm, collaboration and coop-

eration. “One of the most rewarding parts of my academic leadership jobs in the USA and Nigeria focused on Social responsibility or ‘civic learning and action’ which are my key values and high priorities,” Prof. Ensign said.

High Court Rejects Omtatah’s Application To Cross-Examine Kingi, Wetagula On Affidavits

The High Court has rejected an application to cross examine National Assembly Speaker Moses Wetangula and his Senate counterpart Amason Kingi on their affidavits in the petition challenging the Finance Act 2023. The application by Busia Senator Okiya Omtatah had challenged the legality of the new tax measures arguing the bill did not pass through the Senate as required of laws that touch on counties. Both Wetangula and Kingi however swore affidavits saying there was concurrence. Omtatah challenged the Housing Levy stating that it is a devolved function and the bill ought to have been discussed by Senators. The Second petitioner Eliud Matin-

di also sought to have Wetang’ula cross-examined over the same. Wetangula and Kingi’s lawyers opposed the application saying their affidavits were factual and supported by evidence.

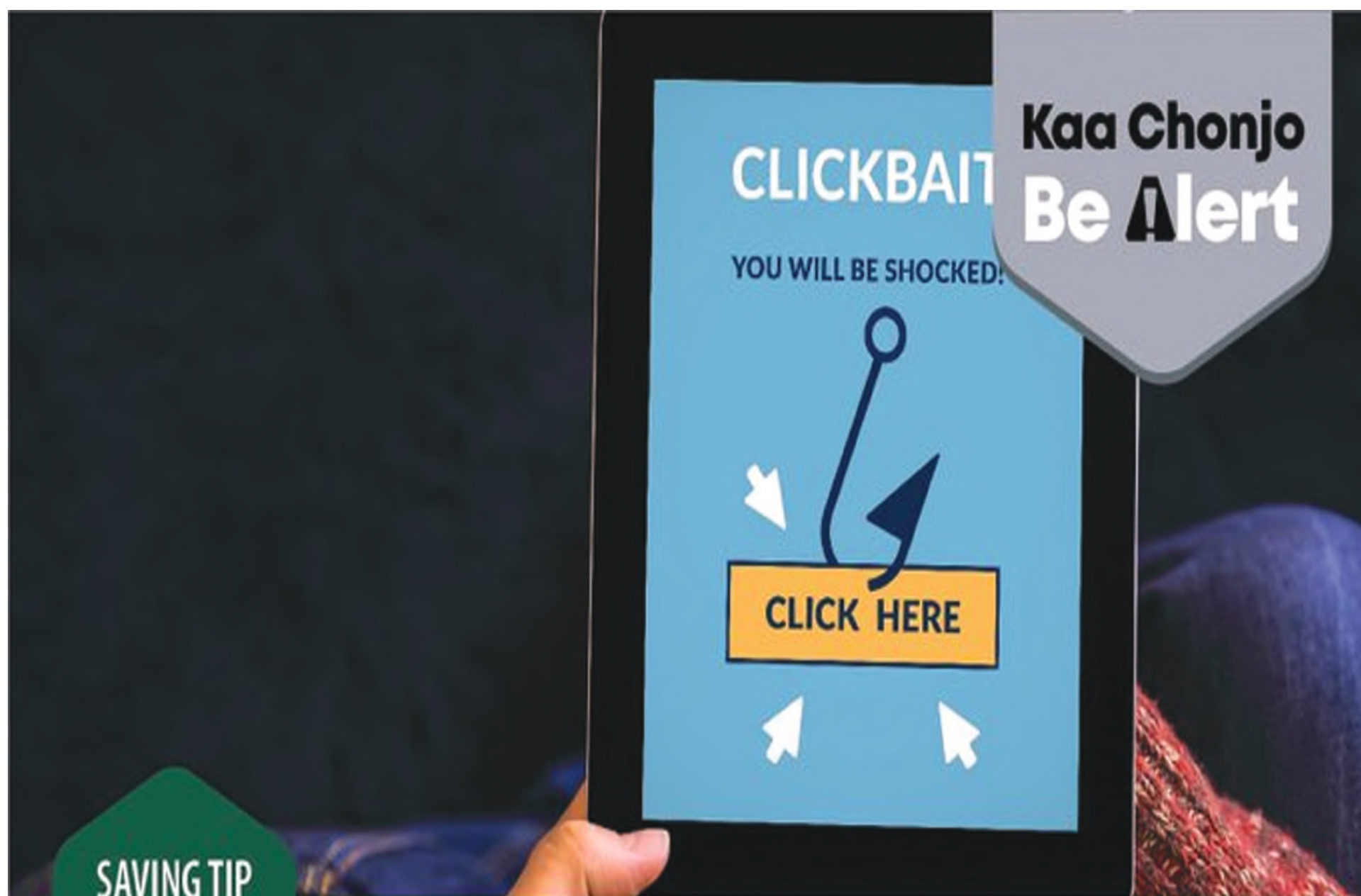

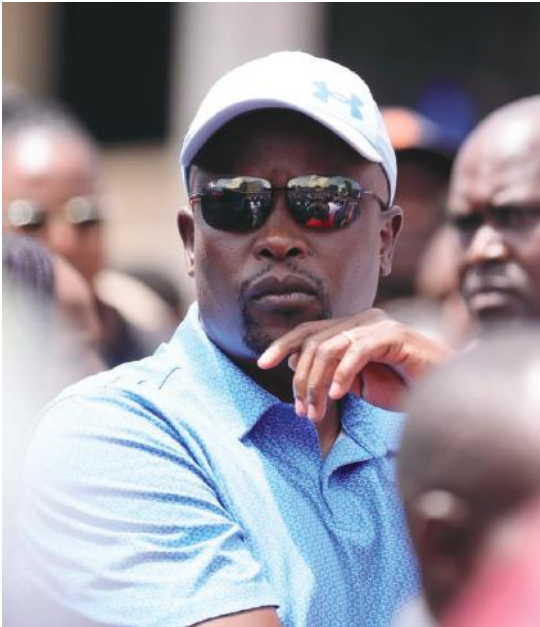

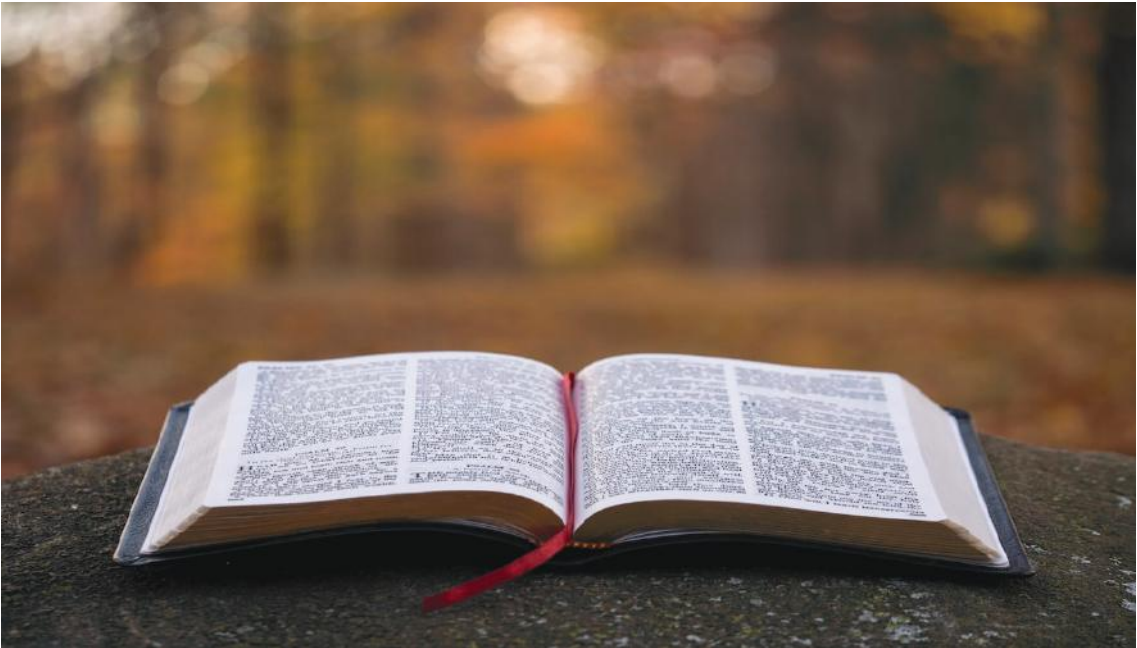
That David felt Jonathan’s love was “more wonderful than that of women” would not have been said if he had a good monogamous marriage! This is testimony to the poverty of his relationships with his wives, an inevitable result of the sin of multiplying wives (cf. Deuteronomy 17:17). However, there is no hint of sensuality here, but simply a celebration of a deep friendship — Jonathan’s mutuality of soul, Jonathan’s commitment, Jonathan’s loyalty, and Jonathan’s encouragement — elements David would never know in any other relationship.

David and Jonathan’s friendship shows us what a deep friendship can and ought to be. C. S. Lewis said, “Friendship . . . is the instrument by which God reveals to each the beau-

ties of all others.” This is certainly what the friendship of David and Jonathan does for us. It reveals the beauties that can be ours in a deep male relationship grounded in God and sets the standard for all deep friendships.

Today friendship has fallen on hard times. Few men have good friends, much less deep friendships. Individualism, autonomy, privatization, and isolation are culturally cachet, but deep, devoted, vulnerable friendship is not. This is a great tragedy for self, family, and the Church, because it is in relationships that we develop into what God wants us to be. But deep friendships and friendships in general (close friendships, good friendships, and casual friendships) are there to be made if we value them as we ought — and if we practice some simple disciplines of friendship.

We MUST PRAY SPECIFICALLY FOR GOD’S HELP IN EFFECTING INWARD CHANGES that will expand our capacities for friendship. And we must pray for the opportunity to develop friendships. Such relational requests may not occur naturally to the minds of most men, but they are



prayers which God delights to answer, as my own experience, and that of many other Christian men, amply testifies. Need some good friendships? Spiritual logic demands that prayer is the place to begin. SELAH! TO GOD BE THE GLORY FOR ANSWERING US.

NHIF To Get A New CEO Soon

Health and Sanitation Cabinet Secretary Susan Nakhumicha has said that in one month’s time, the National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) will have a new CEO.

Speaking at a funeral service in Bungoma over the weekend, the CS noted that when she took over the health docket, it was in a huge mess.

“When I was appointed the CS for Health, I found the Ministry in a huge mess. There was corruption both at Kemsu and NHIF, which I have managed to contain and will be installing a new CEO soon,” Nakhumicha noted.

To improve health delivery to the grassroots, Nakhumicha said the government has employed 100,000 community health promoters who have been equipped with first aid kits.

She said the community health promoters will be moving around the communi-

ty to help offer first aid to the sick.

“The work of the community health promoters is not only offering first aid but also sensitising locals on the importance of enrolling in NHIF health cover,” she said.

The CS called on the locals to register in large numbers to access the health services without straining.

She revealed that the government intends to lower the NHIF subscription fee from Sh500 to Sh300 to allow many people to get enrolled.

She said the government has injected Sh4.1 billion into the Linda Mama programme to help expectant mothers deliver in a decent environment, cater for all antenatal care visits (ANC), pay for the delivery fees at the facility, and cater for four clinic visits after delivery.

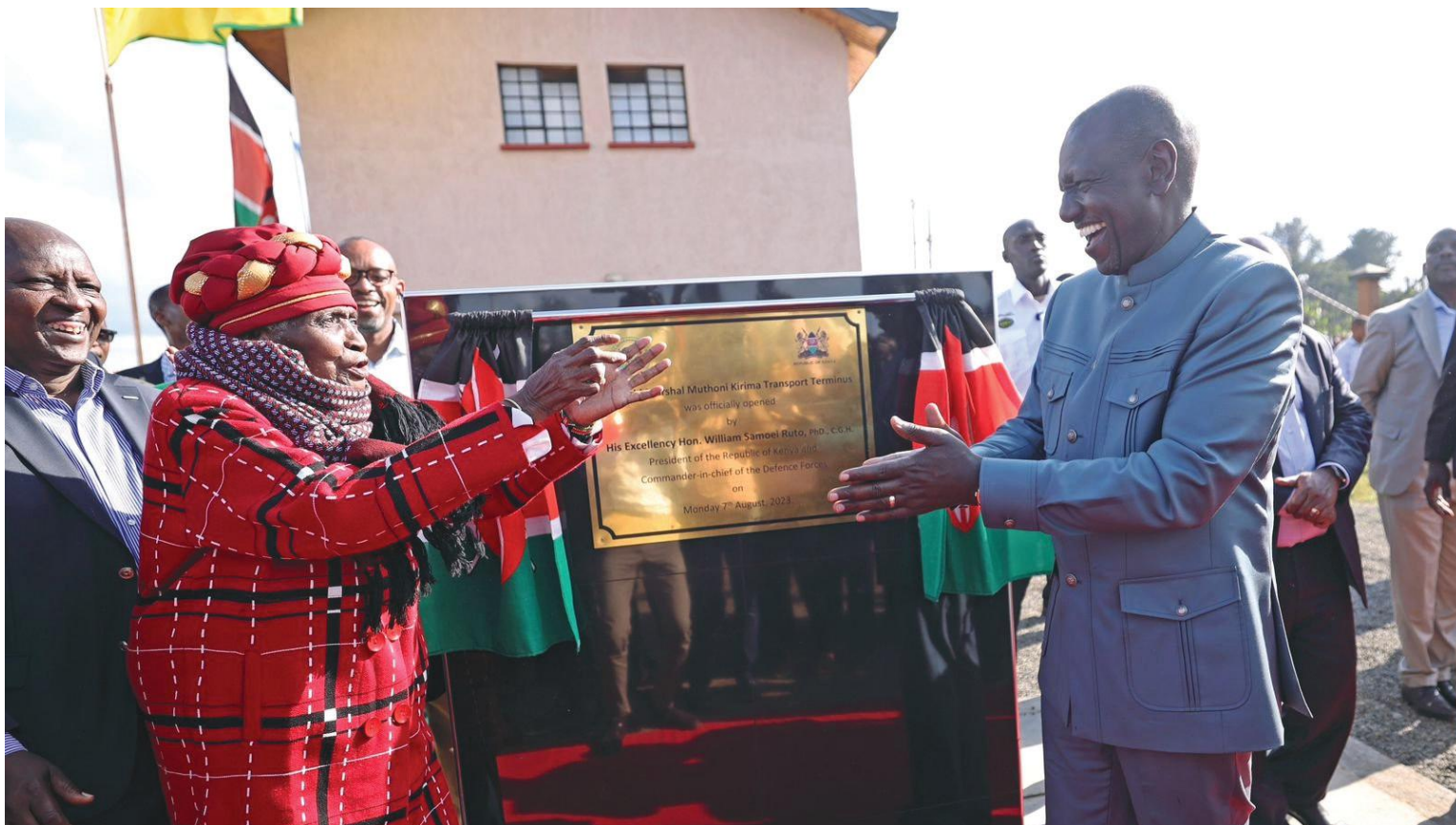
Negative Comments On Sagana Lunch Amounted To Cheap Politics, Idle Talk

This is not the first time that Raila would challenge the presidential elections results.

He had done this during the reign of President Mwai Kibaki and his successor Uhuru Kenyatta. He lost all the petitions except one.

In the aftermath of 2017 polls, then Chief Justice David Maraga had given him a second chance. He however shocked the whole world when he boycotted the repeat polls.

Teaching Elementary School Students Based On New Methods..

International assessment systems, which are developed and put into practice as a result of high pedagogical factors in today’s developed period, at the same time serve as a practical experience for free assimilating students. The immediate main task of pedagogues working in primary school is to work individually with students whose learning level in the class or group is lower than the learning level of students who study well, and during the day and week. It consists of regular monitoring, analysis and continuous control of the student’s educational activity. The use of five general directions of pedagogical technologies is justified when working with children who have difficulty adapting to school, who have lost interest in learning for various reasons, or who are more talented in practical issues than in scientific research. These are child-centered education, interactive and modern methods of teaching, didactic game, cooperative learning, and problem-based learning technologies. Achievements in the fields of science, technology, production and technology require the cre-

ation of new generation textbooks for educational institutions operating at all stages of the continuous education system.

Types of independent work, first of all, should be carefully thought out by the teacher, directed to the educational goal and continuous. In this, the opportunity of each student should be taken into account, age characteristics, interests should not be neglected. One of the conditions for the mental development of students is to complete tasks by “remembering”. In this case, special attention is paid to the ability to define the plan and choose the work method while understanding (imagining) the purpose of the work to be performed, to be able to independently find the mistakes made and to correct them. It is useful to choose convenient methods, ask guiding questions, and recommend key words so that students can complete tasks quickly and correctly.

It is natural that students have difficulties in performing independent work with quality. Because their imagination is still bright and their vocabulary is not enough. Experi-

ments show that children think faster when they work under the guidance of a teacher. In order not to get used to this situation, it is necessary to encourage them to think more independently. If the child is satisfied with the first independent work, his interests will increase and he will start to do new types of work. The results of independent work should always be checked. Verification can be oral or written. Before writing, the child thinks, summarizes his thoughts verbally, and then begins to write them. He tries to express his opinion, make an observation about a question or issue that has been allowed. This process appears and is strengthened on the basis of (verbal) speech. For example, a student thinks before expressing his thoughts in writing. In

a whisper, he talks about the names on his own (in pedagogy, this asset is considered active). The first forms of essay writing begin with such works. The child reads the text, analyzes it orally, comes up with titles, and plans what pictures to make.

In primary grades, it is important to protect students from stress and various psychological influences, and to strengthen their knowledge through interesting games. The teacher’s use of games that encourage students to be smart and quick and to express their thoughts correctly and clearly gives effective results.

Denounce Violence Before Talks Begin, Ruto Tells Opposition

President William Ruto says the opposition must denounce violence before the 10- member bi-partisan dialogue committee can begin talks. Acknowledging sentiments by Azimio La Umoja One Kenya Coalition leader Raila Odinga that he was not interested in joining President Ruto’s administration, the Head of State says he has instructed his team to talk with the opposition but a political handshake and violence experienced during anti-government protests are off the table. And of his meeting with the political leadership in Mount Kenya on Tuesday, President William Ruto maintained that the anticipated dialogue between government and Opposition would only happen under specified parameters.

Reacting to the Azimio La Umoja One Kenya Coalition leader Raila Odinga’s sentiments, the President called on the Opposition to go a step further and denounce violence witnessed in the recent anti-government protests. The Geothermal Development Company (GDC) has achieved a momentous feat by successfully drilling a geothermal well with a capacity of 22 Mega Watts at Paka Hills in Baringo County.

This accomplishment has propelled GDC's regional power output to a total of 70 MW, positioning the company closer to engaging in power generation activities within the area.

While unveiling the well at the weekend, Energy CS Davis Chirchir hailed this discovery as a significant stride towards reducing power costs and bringing Kenya closer to its green energy aspirations.

"We stand with immense pride as a nation. By the end of this year, we anticipate initiating the tender process and inviting investors to harness the extracted steam for electricity generation," declared the CS.

The CS noted that this achievement has notably lowered electricity tariffs, underscoring the government's unwavering commitment to developing the country's geothermal resources.

"Traditionally, a geothermal well would produce around 5 MW. Hence, achieving 22 MW is akin to drilling four wells at the cost of just one, marking a remarkable accomplishment," Mr. Ngugi conveyed enthusiastically.

Mr. Ngugi applauded the innovative

technology of directional drilling employed by the company's engineers, which contributed to this remarkable success. This technology enables the establishment of multiple wells on a single well pad.

"The capacity to tap into substantial resources from a single pad streamlines the setup of a power plant on a consolidated site, effectively reducing the extensive civil works required for steam collection," he elaborated.

According to GDC's projections, the Paka field was initially slated to generate 100 MW by 2030. However, given the current pace of progress, it is likely that a power plant will become operational ahead of schedule.

"This news is exceptional for a nation firmly committed to green energy and the reduction of power costs," Mr. Ngugi elucidated.

Geothermal power is recognized for its cost-effectiveness in the country, and the government pins its hopes on this abundant natural resource to counteract the escalating power expenses.

In addition to Paka Hills, GDC is actively advancing projects in Silali and Korosi within Baringo County, Suswa in Narok and Kajiado Counties, and the Menengai Geothermal Project situated in Nakuru County. In Menengai, GDC has harnessed geothermal steam resources totaling 170 MW.

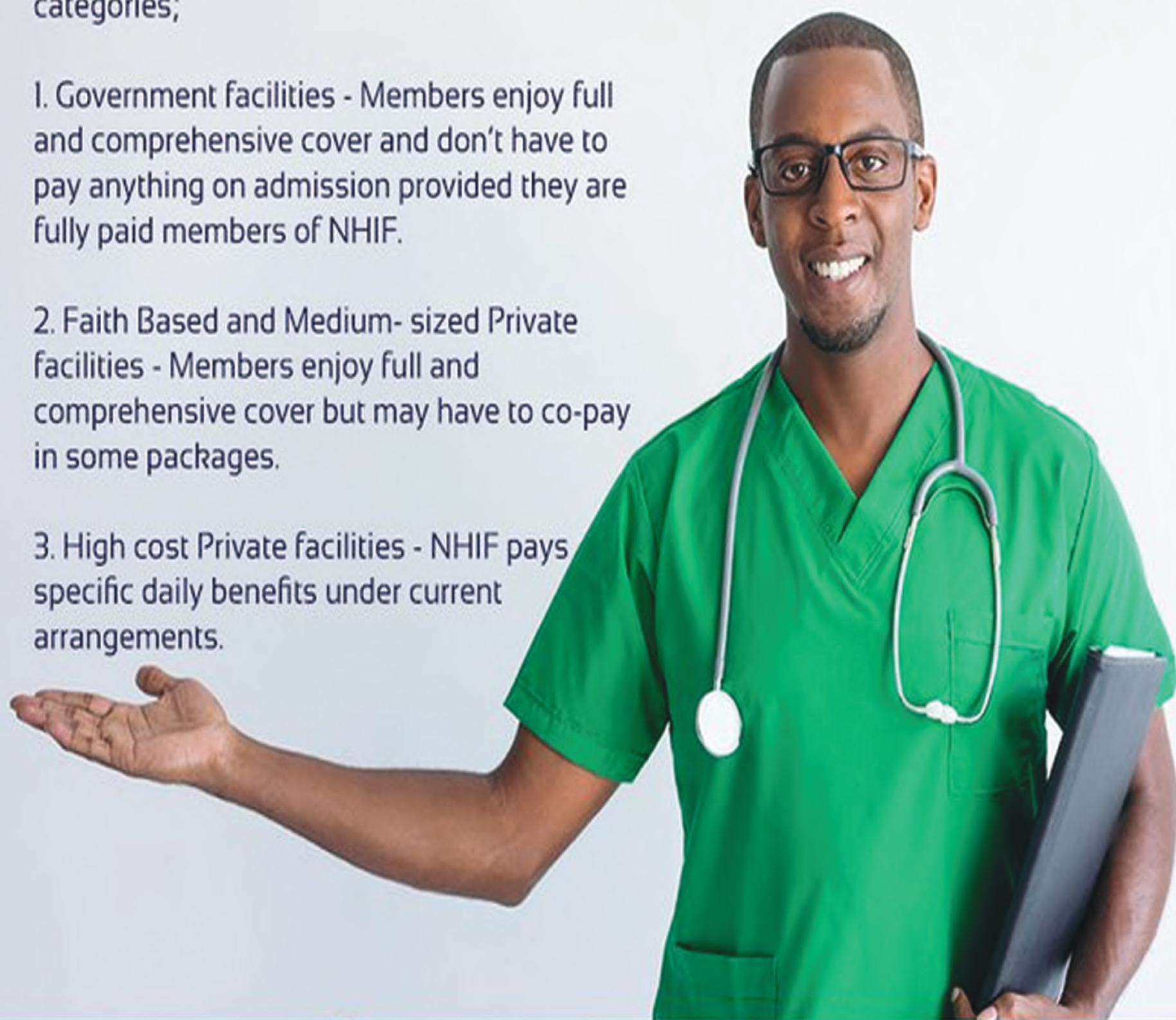
A trio of Independent Power Producers (IPPs) secured contracts to generate 35 MW each, resulting in a combined output of 105 MW. Notably, Sosian Power, one of the IPPs, is already generating 35 MW, while another IPP, Globeleq LTD, began construction in June and is expected to commence power plant construction by the end of the year.



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Finance Act: EPRA Boss Summoned For Contempt Of Court

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The Energy and Petroleum Regulatory Authority (EPRA) Managing Director, Daniel Kiptoo has been summoned by the High Court for contempt of court over the implementation of 16pc fuel levy.

The court issued the summon on Monday during a mention of the Finance Act petition.

A three-judge bench led by Justice David Majanja ordered Kiptoo to appear in person on September 13th, 2023 when the case will be heard.

Kiptoo is expected to show cause why he should not be held in contempt of court for disobeying orders issued by Justice Mugure Thande on the suspension of Finance Act 2023.

Busia Senator Okiya Omtatah had sued Kiptoo, after the authority increased fuel pump prices despite a high court order that had stopped the implementation of the Act.

The bench also gave room to the

petitioners to allow consolidation of all the petitions so that it can ease their work when the case begins, a move that was applauded by all the petitioners.

Omtatah’s application to cross-examine the speakers of both the National Assembly and the Senate on their sworn affidavits was however thwarted by the court.

At the same time, the Law Society of Kenya’s prayer to persuade the court to suspend the court of appeal ruling on the implementation of the Finance Act 2023 was also rejected.

“We find that the Court of Appeal dealt with the issue of conservatory orders sought and we do not see any reason to depart from the directives issued,” Justice Majanja said.

The petitioners, respondents, and interested parties have been ordered to file their applications by the latest 31st of August 2023.

The bench has consolidated all the 10 petitions that had been filed by different individuals and organizations and set to hear them concurrently.

The bombings are widely believed

to have been revenge for U.S. involvement in the extradition, and alleged torture, of four members of Egyptian Islamic Jihad who had been arrested in Albania in the two months prior to the attacks for a series of murders in Egypt.

The following month, a communique was issued warning the United States that a “response” was being prepared to “repay” them for their interference.

Although the attacks were directed at U.S. facilities, the vast majority of casualties were local citizens of Kenya and Tanzania.

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Kenya, US Senators To Meet Over Embassy Bombing Compensation

The Senate Ad hoc Committee pushing for the compensation to families of Kenyan victims of the August 7, 1998 bombing on the US Embassy in Nairobi is set to meet their United States counterparts for compensation plans next Month.

Doctor Romona Tascoe, a member of the US Embassy stated that she is following up on compensation plans for Kenyan victims.

“Please find mercy and forgiveness for the Americans who are offering an apology. I promise that I will continue to fight for Kenyans victims to receive their compensation,” she said.

According to her, the US citizens victims of the bombing have been compensated.

The nine team members committee led by Machakos County Senator Agnes Kavindu says that it has been 25 years since the bomb blast



occurred and up to date the victims have never been compensated.

“The US victim fund was created in the year 2014 and now it has been over two decades and many of the Kenyan victims continue to seek compensation,” she said.

Senator Kavindu has also called on

the Ministry of health to ensure there is medical treatment cover for the surviving victims of the bombing, adding that some of them got severe injuries and are still in need of medical treatment.

“The bombing claimed the lives of hundreds of innocent people and

should remain vigilant in fighting acts of terrorism.

“The committee is pleading with the US government to work on the proposal to congress and initiate amendments through the US victims of state sponsored terrorism Acts and request consideration to make Kenyan victims eligible to participate in the US victim terrorist compensation fund,” she added.

At least 213 Kenyans in Nairobi were killed in the attack caused by the Al Qaeda terrorist group targeting the US embassy.

Kavindu says that the committee will coordinate with the ministry of foreign and Diaspora affairs in the engagement of victims representing the Us Government stakeholders in Kenya and Abroad to pursue and accomplish compensation of Kenyan victims’ families.

This committee is mandated to support eligibility of Kenyans and Americans victims spouses and next of kin in the victim compensation fund,” Kavindu Said.

Kenya Victims Of 1998 US Embassy Bombing Demand Compensation

Kenyan victims of the 1998 US embassy bombing in Nairobi on Monday renewed calls for compensation from Washington as the East African nation marked 25 years since its deadliest terror attack.

A powerful blast hit the US embassy in downtown Nairobi on August 7, 1998, killing 213 people and injuring over 5,000 — most of them pedestrians or office workers in the adjacent buildings.

Minutes later, another explosion rocked the US mission in Dar es Salaam, in neighbouring Tanzania.

The twin bombings, claimed by Al-Qaeda, killed a total of 224 people and went on to shape how a generation thinks about personal security.

The attack “still feels fresh” a quarter century later, said Anisa Mwilu, who lost her husband in the blast.

“What we can ask is for compensation,” she said to applause from several hundred people gathered for a remembrance ceremony for those killed, held at a memorial park in the Kenyan capital.

Caroline Muthoka, a member of a victims’ group, urged the US Congress to approve legislation to cover medical expenses and education costs for survivors and their families.

Muthoka described the failure of the US government to compensate victims as a “injustice”.

Redempta Kadenge Amisi, who was in a building flattened by the explosion, said she needed financial assistance to cover the costs of her twice-daily medication.

– Revenge attacks –

“The three people I was with were killed instantly. I didn’t realise it but my back was on fire,” she said of injuries that hospitalised her for over a month.

“Since the attack, I haven’t received anything... but I still hope to get



some.”

Both Kenyan and US officials attended the ceremony, where the names of all the victims were read out aloud, and candles lit in memory.

The 1998 attack thrust Al-Qaeda onto the global stage and was the first in a series of bloody assaults in the East African nation.

Since the deployment of Kenyan military in Somalia in October 2011 to fight the Al-Qaeda-affiliate Al-Shabaab, there has been an upsurge in revenge attacks over the border.

In September 2013, Al-Shabaab gunmen stormed Nairobi’s Westgate mall, killing at least 67 people.

Another Al-Shabaab attack in April

2015 at a university in the eastern Kenyan city of Garissa left 148 people dead.

In January 2019, the group laid siege to a hotel complex in Nairobi, killing 21 people.

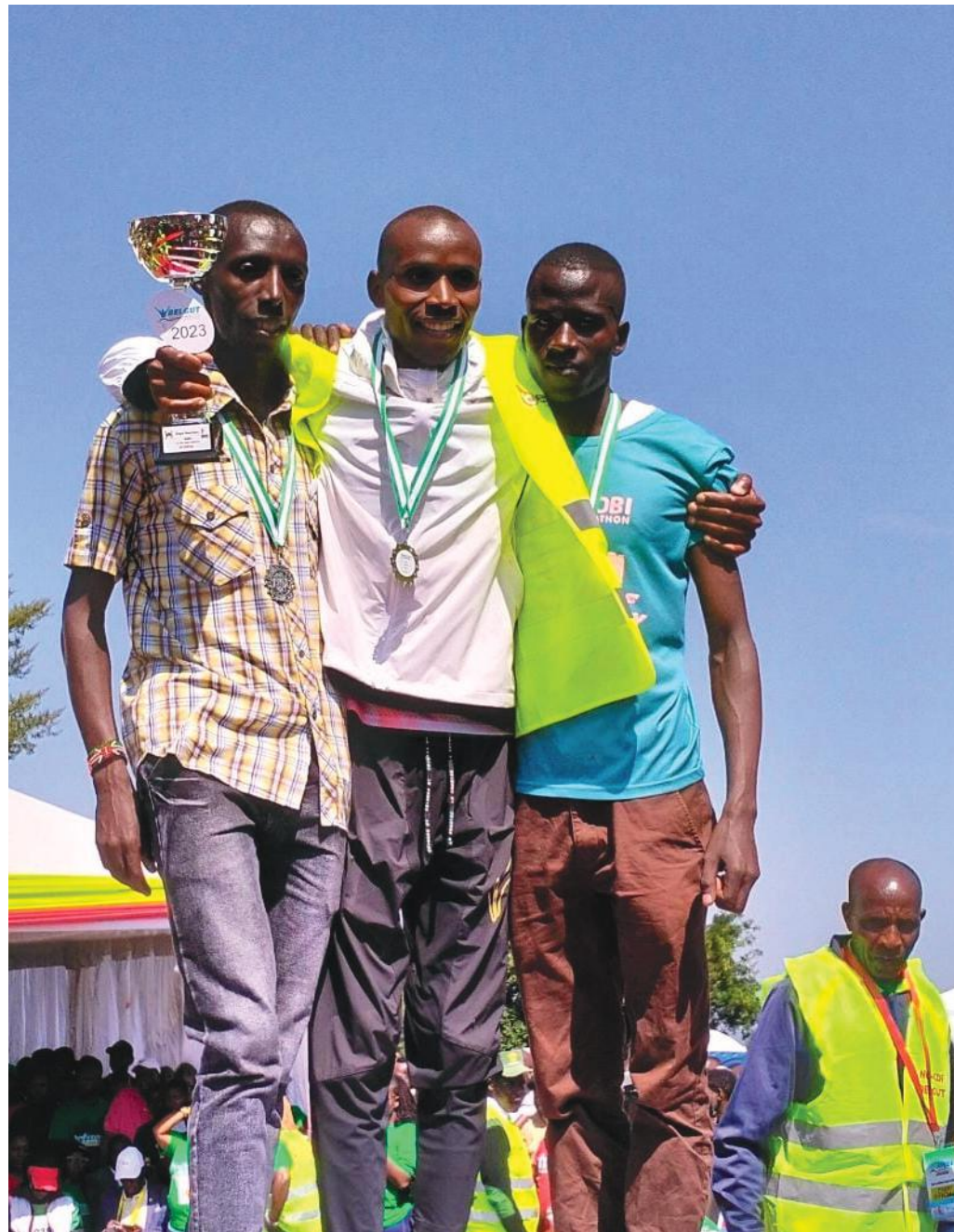
