Hundreds of thousands of excited revellers from all over the United Kingdom’s Caribbean and the African diaspora communities took to the streets of London last Monday in a two-day party full of live music and cultural extravaganza to celebrate one of the world’s best carnivals. The 57th edition of the annual Notting Hill Carnival is a well-loved event that celebrates the culture, history and broader contribution of the Caribbean community in the United Kingdom. The organisers billed the event as the greatest community-led event on the planet in which

not only the diaspora but also local Britons also joined to celebrate. It usually brings more than 1 million visitors sprawling the streets of London. This year, an estimated two million people attended the event over two days – double the number initially expected – proving the growing popularity of this half-a-century-old event. There was no shortage of fun under the clear, sunny blue London sky, bringing a taste of the tropics in a country usually hit by the vagaries of weather including the bitter winters. # Nuclear energy will help Africa fulfil industrialization agenda – Kenyan student

*Besides energy, there are numerous opportunities offered by nuclear in areas of medicine and agriculture. Nuclear energy has zero emissions too. We are debunking myths and misconceptions associated with this technology - Robert Siro*

Robert Folkenberg Siro

A Kenyan student studying nuclear engineering in Russia has made a case and amplified the voice of scholars rooting for the adoption of nuclear technologies in Africa.

Robert Folkenberg Siro said Africa should embrace nuclear energy which he described as clean, safe, efficient, and critical in dealing with the energy crunch that is hindering the continent from taking the next step towards development.

Compared to other energy sources, Siro says nuclear can be easily deployed and would operate continuously and reliably, irrespective of the location, offering the much-needed energy security which is a driving force

for industrialization.

“I think exploring nuclear energy will be an opportunity for Africa. We have numerous categories of reactors. There are small modular reactors to small nuclear power plants that countries can build even in remote locations. For instance, here in Russia, the small modular reactors have worked successfully like in the case of floating nuclear power plants, that supply energy to remote locations in the country,” explained Siro, a student of thermal physics at Russia’s National Research Nuclear University.

Siro who received a scholarship from the Russian state atomic energy corporation,

Rosatom, to pursue his university studies adds; “Exploiting this option will be beneficial to African countries. It has worked for them, and I am sure it will work for us,”

Speaking on the sidelines of the recent Russia-Africa Summit in St. Petersburg, Siro pointed to studies showing that the industry benefits greatly from nuclear technology. Besides reliable power, Siro who specializes in thermal-hydraulics, emphasized that nuclear helps improve product quality while boosting industrial productivity.

He says a country like Kenya, for example, is keen to achieve Vision 2030, a development blueprint that he

observes heavily relies on energy.

“I believe nuclear energy will help Kenya realize this agenda,” he said, noting that Russia, with its expertise, can intervene to great benefit.

“Whereas Kenya has done well in other energy sources such as hydro and geothermal, nuclear would really make the country’s power grid stronger and powerful,” he said

Besides, the third-year student says nuclear technologies can help Africa address the food insecurity challenge. He says nuclear technology offers huge opportunities in agriculture.

Here, he says nuclear helps in the development of ag-

ricultural technologies that promote farming as manifested through increased crop production, and control of pests and diseases.

“Through nuclear, there are ways we can facilitate the growth of plants as well as inhibiting poor growth among many other things,” he said while also citing new seed varieties that have higher yields, developed through nuclear technologies.

“It’s crucial because we are also intending to go at par with countries that have progressed,” he avers

At the same time, Siro spoke highly of nuclear’s zero-emissions advantage, making it environmentally friendly. He says nuclear will come in handy in the development of smart city projects such as Kenya’s Konza Technopolis.

“One of the key issues in smart cities is that you have to ensure that the pollution aspect is eliminated, especially given carbon dioxide emissions, and so forth. And in Nuclear energy there are zero emissions,” he said

He expressed delight that most African countries are sending students to Russia to pursue studies in nuclear technologies but challenged more students from the continent to look out for opportunities in the same field.

As an advocate of nuclear technologies, he says while public perception of nuclear has been somehow negative, he is encouraged that the view is slowly changing.

“What we do as nuclear ambassadors is to try to debunk the myths and misconceptions associated with these technologies,” he said, even as he lauded Rosatom for promoting initiatives aimed at exposing nations to the benefits of nuclear.

Courtesy of the agencies’ efforts, more African countries are expressing their interest in developing nuclear infrastructure programmes. A number of them signed up for the development of nuclear programmes during the summit.

Besides delicacies from Jamaica, the tempting menu also brought treats from the rest of the region - Trinidadian roti and Guyanese pepper pot, among many other culinary delights.

Women were dressed in opulent, daringly low-cut tops, colourful Caribbean carnival costumes with feathered head tops.

Crowds watched elaborate floats and costumed performers wind through the streets in the carnival parade, dance to the sound of steel bands and calypso music, and visit the tempting food stalls along the route. Notting Hill Carnival was first held in 1966 to remember with nostalgia the days back home of Caribbean migrants, a trip down memory lane, and to fight the winter blues. It celebrates the rich history of Caribbean culture in London.

The first Notting Hill Carnival attracted around 500 people. The Carnival has since become the largest street festival in Europe, attracting hundreds of thousands to London every year. There were some 50,000 performers in the parade and more than 30 sound systems, with some two million people over the weekend. The event, which kicked off on 24 August, featured an exciting programme of shows and dances, including Dance the Night Away at Cafe Koko's Love Music Hate Racism: Pre-Carnival Party. 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ty 2023 before the curtains came down on this year's event.

The Carnival officially started on Saturday, when the tropical steel band music competition took place. Children were not forgotten as they came out the next day to enjoy an action-packed entertainment programme. More on this later.

There were all kinds of highly entertaining family shows. The word 'Jouvert' stems from the French 'Jour ouvert' meaning 'opening of the day'. It is a tradition in the Caribbean to launch Carnival just before sunrise, continuing into daybreak.

Jouvert morning is one of Notting Hill Carnival's best-kept secrets. Drove of hardcore revellers converged onto the streets of Notting Hill in the very early hours of the morning to celebrate the opening of Carnival, to dance and get merry. They saw colourful paints and powders instead of the mud and oil of Caribbean tradition, but the high energy and party pandemonium was, without doubt, universal.

Traditionally, Carnival is opened by the local residents and participants, accompanied by the organisers and friends of Carnival.

The atmosphere was very good, with all the participants and visitors enjoying an excellent natural and enjoyable experience.

They enjoyed a musical treat of fantastic steel drum bands and exotic foods which was a once in a year treat for many non-Caribbean revelers.

The Carnival spread out in west London and saw 50,000 performers, 100 live stage shows, 38 static sound systems and 300 food stalls.

There was also a wide variety of Brazilian, Mas, and Sound System Bands.

Even though some two million people attend the two-day event, the Notting Hill Carnival has always remained a beautifully organised family event.

Flags of the countries in the Caribbean region were proudly displayed everywhere on the route.

The excitement of this annual event was so great that revellers arrived at the Notting Hill area of London to

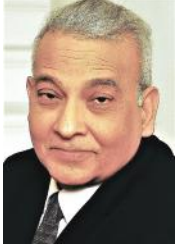

The Metro or London Underground tube station's entrances were jam-packed with revellers arriving not only from every part of the British capital but also the country and as far away as Europe to sample the experience of this fantastic show, which one reveller described as "organised mayhem". One of the Carnival's highlights was the parade route, which took place over three-and-a-half-mile loop around the British capital.

It started from Westbourne Park Tube Station, along the Great Western Road to Westbourne Grove and then to Ladbroke Grove. It then looped down Kensal Road and back to Westbourne Grove.

Physically fit diasporans walked the entire route, whereas the ageing and infirm community members walked a short distance.

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There was no shortage of excitement and celebration for the Notting Hill Carnival, which comes only once a year.

Revellers loved to dance in the street, as one could see the joy on their faces.

Sound Systems is a well-established and integral part of Notting Hill Carnival. It is a tradition rooted in Jamaican culture and Reggae music, which the Carnival revellers heard with great delight. There was everything from Rare Groove to House to Samba.

Besides the fun element of the Carnival, this year's event differed from the

previous years. It marked the 75th anniversary of the HMT Empire Windrush docking at London's Tilbury Docks, bringing a group of Caribbean workers who helped rebuild Britain after the ravages of the Second World War.

There was a Windrush-themed bus in this year's parade. The Bus's significance will not be lost as it depicted a vital era of Caribbean diaspora history, which many surviving older generations from the Caribbean diaspora remember.

The event's organisers are always interested in making the event safe and go to great lengths to ensure a trouble-free event.

But sadly, at times, untoward incidents happen. There have been stabbings and attacks by angry young revellers on drugs in the past which left a bitter taste and generated security fears among those planning to attend.

This year, even though the event was policed by more than 9,000 officers from the Metropolitan Police and other forces, many wayward youths were arrested.

This year, Police made 85 arrests. Among those arrested were 18 for drugs, 11 for sexual assault, 36 for possession of offensive weapons and 10 for alleged assaults on police officers, according to the information released by the Police authorities.

The UK is tackling the cancer of young people carrying knives in their ongoing mission to cut down on knife crime.

This year, the Police took severe action. They set up knife arches along the Carnival route, and Police had stop and search powers given to them overnight; following information received, some revellers had travelled to the Carnival carrying knives. This sparked fears that there could be knife brawls and fights among drunken visitors and revellers.

The added excitement to the 2023 event was that Carnival got a new lease of life. The event was not allowed during the two Covid lockdown years between 2019 and 2021. Its return in 2022, though, with reduced crowds, reignited the affection with which this event

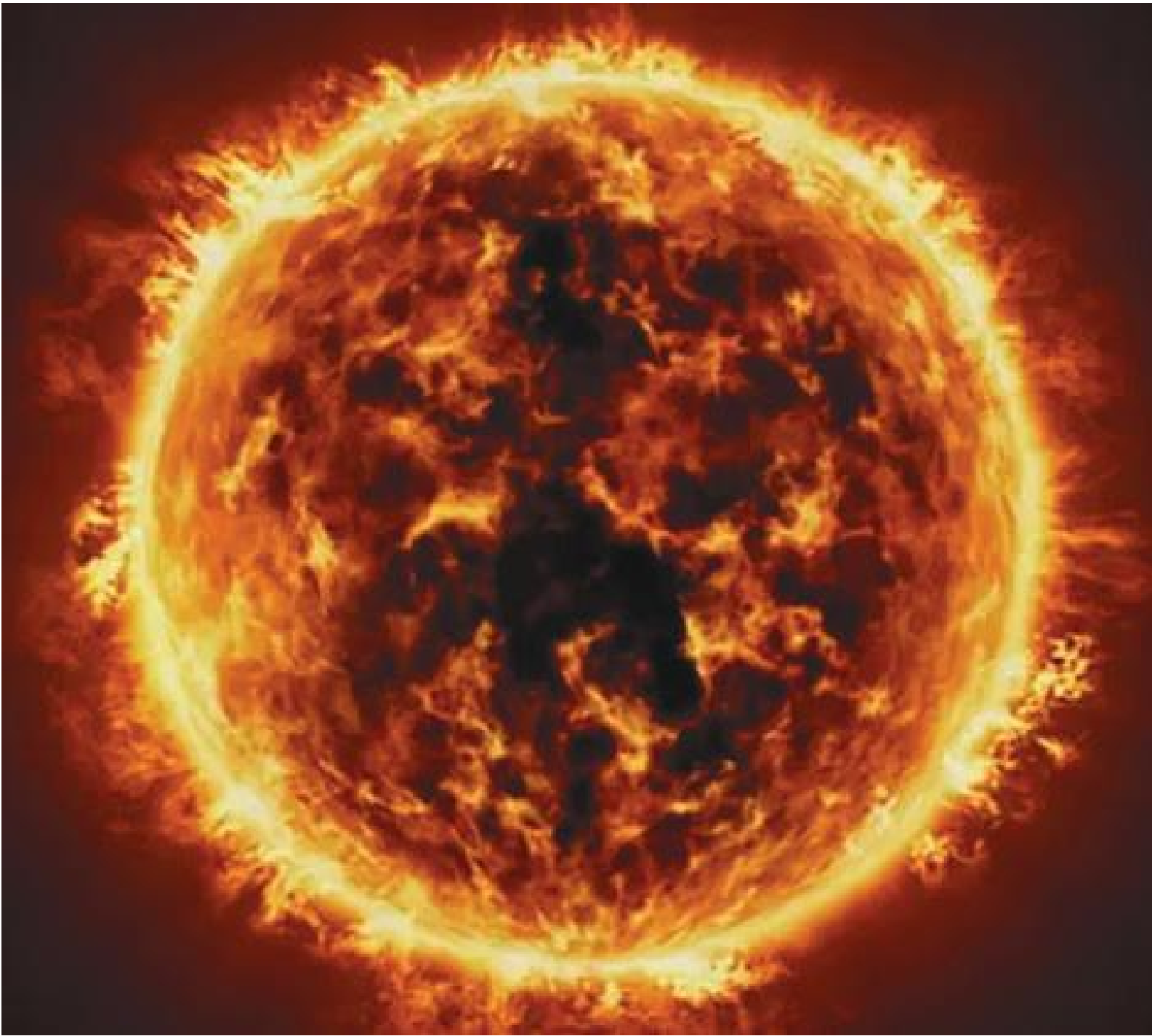
# India set to launch its first mission to Sun

India’s space agency says it will take four months to travel the distance

India is set to launch its first observation mission to the Sun, just days after the country made history by becoming the first to land near the Moon’s south pole. Aditya-L1 is due to blast off from the launch pad at Sriharikota on Saturday at 11:50 India time (06:20 GMT). It will be located at a distance of 1.5 million km (932,000 miles) from the Earth – 1% of the Earth-Sun distance. India’s space agency says it will take four months to travel the distance. India’s first space-based mission to study the solar system’s biggest object is named after Surya – the Hindu god of Sun who is also known as Aditya. And L1 stands for Lagrange point 1 – the exact place between Sun and Earth where the Indian spacecraft will be placed. According to the European Space Agency, a Lagrange point is a spot where the gravitational forces of two

large objects – such as the Sun and the Earth – cancel each other out, allowing a spacecraft to “hover”. Once Aditya-L1 reaches this “parking spot”, it would be able to orbit the Sun at the same rate as the Earth. This also means the satellite will require very little fuel to operate. The Indian Space Research Agency (Isro) says once the spacecraft takes off, it will travel several times around the Earth before being launched towards L1. The studies will help scientists understand solar activity, such as solar wind and solar flares, and their effect on Earth and near-space weather in real time. Former Isro scientist Mylswamy Annadurai says the Sun constantly influences the Earth weather through radiation, heat and flow of particles and magnetic fields. At the same time, he says, it also impacts the space weather. “Space weather plays a role in how effectively the satellites function. Solar winds or storms can affect the electronics on satellites, even knock down power grids. But there are gaps in our knowledge of space weather,” Mr Annadurai told the BBC.

India has more than 50 satellites in space and they provide many crucial services to the country, including communication links, data on weather, and help predict pest infestations, droughts and impending disasters. According to UN’s Office for Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA), approximately 10,290 satellites remain in Earth’s orbit, with nearly 7,800 of them currently operational. Aditya, says Mr Annadurai, will help us better understand, and even give us a forewarning, about the star on which our lives depend. “Knowing the activities of the Sun such as solar wind or a solar eruption a couple of days ahead will help us move our satellites out of harm’s way. This will help increase the longevity of our satellites in space.” India’s solar mission comes just days after the country successfully landed the world’s first-ever probe near the lunar south pole.

With that, India also became only the fourth country in the world to achieve a soft landing on the Moon, after the US, the former Soviet Union and China. If Aditya-L1 is successful, India will join the select group of countries that are already studying the Sun. Japan was the first to launch a mission to Sun in 1981 to study solar flares and the US space agency Nasa and European Space Agency (ESA) have been watching the Sun since the 1990s. In February 2020, Nasa and ESA jointly launched a Solar Orbiter that is studying the Sun from close quarters and gathering data that, scientists say, will help understand what drives its dynamic behaviour. And in 2021, Nasa’s newest spacecraft Parker Solar Probe made history by becoming the first to fly through corona, the outer atmosphere of the Sun.

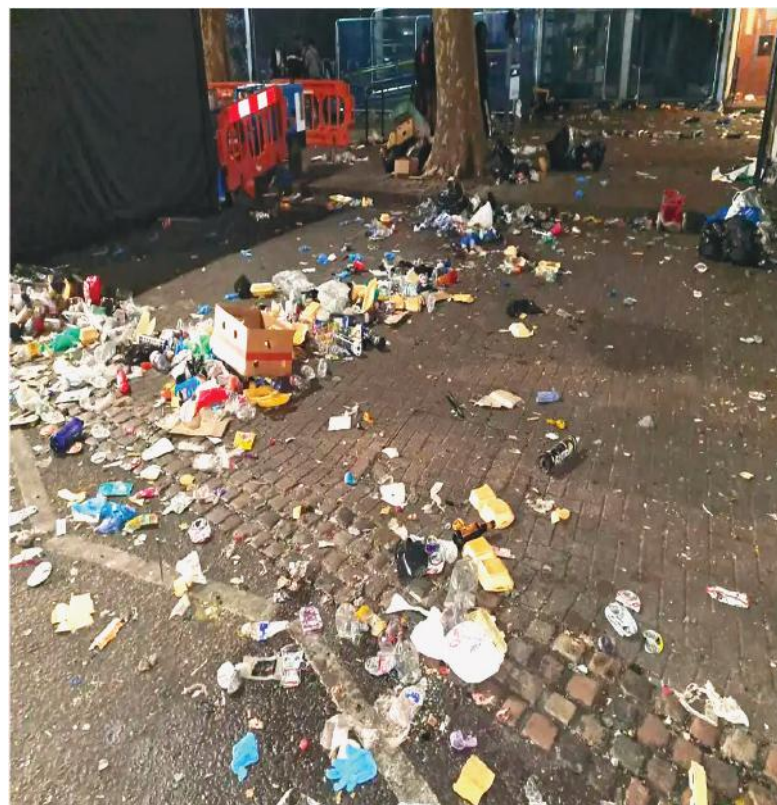

# Africa needs to take leadership of its destiny in climate action

Ahead of the inaugural Africa Climate Summit (ACS), William Asiko, Vice President of the Africa Region Office, The Rockefeller Foundation is calling on Africa to take leadership of its destiny in the climate crisis by focusing on things that the continent has control of. Addressing the media on Friday, Asiko said Africa has an enormous opportunity to develop carbon credit programs and become a green manufacturing leader through policy commitments and appropriate incentives.

“Climate change is affecting us like no other region in the world and yet we did not cause a lot of the effects that are bringing climate change disasters to this continent. Africa needs to take leadership of its destiny in this climate crisis. The Rockefeller Foundation will co-host or contribute to several events during the summit with focus on unlocking climate finance and investment in clean energy and climate-smart food security and public health solutions in Africa and the world.

# Gabon coup leaders name new leader

Army officers who seized power in a coup in Gabon on Wednesday have named Gen Brice Oligui Nguema as the country's transitional leader.

Gen Nguema was earlier carried triumphally through the streets of the capital Libreville by his troops.

The deposed President, Ali Bongo, has appeared in a video at his home, calling on his "friends all over the world" to "make noise" on his behalf.

The former French colony is one of Africa's major oil producers.

In another development, the African Union has suspended Gabon's participation in all of its activities following Wednesday's military takeover, which it strongly condemned. Mr Bongo's overthrow ended his family's 55-year hold on power in the Central African state.

Army officers appeared on TV in the early hours of Wednesday to say they had taken power.

They said they had annulled the results of Saturday's election in which Mr Bongo was declared the winner but which the opposition said was fraudulent.

The officers also said they had arrested one of Mr Bongo's sons for treason.

Within hours, generals met to discuss who would lead the transition and agreed by a unanimous vote to appoint Gen Nguema, former head of the presidential guard.

Gen Nguema told France's Le Monde newspaper that Gabonese

people had had enough of Ali Bongo's rule, and that he should not have run for a third term.

"Everyone talks about this but no one takes responsibility," he said. "So the army decided to turn the page." Crowds in Libreville and elsewhere celebrated the army's declaration.

But the coup was condemned by the

UN, the African Union and France, which had close ties to the Bongo family.

The US state department urged Gabon's military to "preserve civilian rule" and urged "those responsible to release and ensure the safety of members of government". The UK condemned the "unconstitutional

military takeover" of power.

There has long been simmering resentment of the Bongo family – it ruled Gabon for almost 56 years – and there has been public discontent over broader issues such as the cost of living.

"At first I was scared, but then I felt joy," a resident of Libreville, who re-

quested anonymity, told the BBC. "I was scared because of the realisation that I am living through a coup, but the joy is because we've been waiting for so long for this regime to be overthrown."

A deadly fire in Johannesburg's inner city was "a wake-up call" for South Africa, says President Cyril Ramaphosa.

Seventy-four people were killed – including 12 children – after a blaze in a five-storey building, which was being occupied by homeless people. More than 50 others were injured.

Earlier, the city of Johannesburg confirmed it owned the building, but said cartels had taken it over. Officials say the cause of the deadly fire is unclear.

In a news conference at the site of the fire, Mr Ramaphosa said the incident needed to be investigated and lessons learnt to prevent future tragedies.

"It's a wake-up call for us to begin to address the situation of housing in the inner city," the South African leader said.

The building used to be a home for abused women and children, but once the lease expired, it was "hijacked", President Ramaphosa explained to reporters.

Many properties around the area where the blaze happened have been deemed unfit to live in.

Yet these old blocks, abandoned by

their owners or the city authorities, are full of families, often paying rent to criminal gangs who run them.

Some of those who use the buildings include undocumented migrants, mostly from other African countries.

The buildings, which lack running water, toilets or a legal electricity connection, are then said to have been "hijacked".

South Africa faces a chronic housing shortage, with an estimated 15,000 people estimated to be homeless in Johannesburg.

"We need to get on top of this and find effective ways of dealing with problems of accommodation, of housing, and services in the inner city," Mr Ramaphosa added.

He also commended emergency services, who arrived at the scene 10 minutes after the fire was reported. Johannesburg city manager Floyd Brink said 200 families were affected by the fire and "all efforts" were taken to provide accommodation.

A spokesman for the emergency services, Robert Mulaudzi, told the BBC that the fire had gutted the building but firefighters had been able to bring out some of the occupants.

He explained that because the build-



ing was not properly looked after, makeshift structures and debris had made it hard to search for and rescue people.

A video posted by Mr Mulaudzi to the platform X, formerly known as Twitter, showed fire trucks and ambulances outside the building with burnt-out windows.

Photos from the scene showed covered bodies lined up near the burned building.

One woman told journalists she was outside the building searching for her 24-year-old daughter.

"As soon as I heard the building was

burning down, I knew I had to run here to come and look for her," she said.

"Now that I'm here, I'm kept in suspense because I really don't know what is happening. I don't get any direction – so I'm actually very anxious, I don't know if my daughter is alive."

In a visit to the scene, Johannesburg mayor Kabelo Gwamanda said Johannesburg officials would relocate people living in similar "hijacked" buildings in the city, and turn those buildings into social housing. "We are not going there with brute force,"

he told reporters, "we are trying to apply a sensitive strategy."

Asked whether his administration would take responsibility for the tragedy, Mr Gwamanda said the government was dealing with the issue of cartels hijacking buildings, which was taking place across the city.

In the wake of the fire, many South Africans on social media condemned the online xenophobic attacks that some have made against the victims and survivors of the fire.

# UN chief 'firmly condemns' Gabon coup, notes reports of election abuses

The UN Secretary-General on Wednesday firmly condemned the on-going coup attempt in Gabon, while acknowledging that "serious infringements of fundamental freedoms" appear to have taken place during elections at the weekend. Spokesperson Stéphane Dujarric said that UN chief António Guterres was following the evolving situation in the capital Libreville "very closely". While condemning military action as "a means to resolve the post electoral crisis", the Secretary-General said he had noted the announcement by the Central African nation's electoral body of a win for incumbent president Ali Bongo with "deep concern" given reports of serious irregularities at the polls.

## 'Strong opposition' to coups

This announcement of a military takeover in the capital by a group of officers who declared the election results void and the dissolution of State institutions, would mark the eighth coup – if successful – in West and Central Africa since 2020. "The Secretary-General reaffirms

his strong opposition to military coups", said the UN Spokesperson. According to news reports, the coup leaders have placed President Bongo under house arrest, ending in effect more than half a century of dynastic rule. The current president's father, Omar, came to power in 1967, and after violent unrest erupted following his disputed election victory in 2016, there was a foiled coup attempt in 2019.

News reports said the coup leaders calling themselves The Committee of Transition and the Restoration of Institutions, had declared the country to be in a state of institutional, political, economic and social crisis. So far, there has been no response from the existing Government and the president's whereabouts are unknown. The country is currently an elected member of the UN Security Council.

## Dialogue and restraint call

"The Secretary-General calls on all actors involved to exercise restraint, engage in an inclusive and meaningful dialogue and ensure that the rule of law and human rights are fully respected", said the statement issued by his Spokesperson. "He also calls on the national army and security forces to guarantee the physical integrity of the President of

the Republic and his family."

## Standing with the people

Dujarric also stressed that the UN "stands by the people of Gabon." Questioned by correspondents at the daily Noon Briefing in New York on the pattern of military coups across the region, he said the best way of dealing with them "is in fact to invest more in preventing them prior, in investing in strong institutions, in ensuring that elections are safe, that people are able to express themselves, that human rights are respected." The UN has 81 international staff and 163 national staff working in the country and Dujarric said that latest information suggested that all staff and their families were safe and sound. "Our broader concern is really for the people of Gabon, and people of countries that have undergone military coups recently which is a clear violation of their rights."

# Rights experts call for second UN Decade for People of African Descent

Human rights experts on Wednesday urged the UN General Assembly to declare a second International Decade for People of African Descent starting in 2025 as more action is needed to combat racism and other intolerance. They stressed that more than ever, the world urgently needs humanity to unite and collaborate in a spirit of equality and non-discrimination. "This demands political will to eliminate all forms of racial discrimination, inequality and stratification at both the domestic and international levels," they said in a statement. Achieving this goal means that inequalities within and among countries will need to be drastically decreased, and the legacies of colonialism, apartheid, enslavement and genocide effectively resolved, they added.

## 'A cause for humanity'

The General Assembly proclaimed 2015 to 2024 as the International Decade for People of African Descent, with actions at the national, regional and global levels.

Objectives include promoting respect, protection and fulfilment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by people of African Descent, and greater knowledge of their diverse heritage, culture and contributions to society. "The cause of people of African descent for recognition, justice and development is a cause for humanity," the experts stated.

## Sustain the momentum

They said the UN Decade, together with the International Convention on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination and the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action, have contributed significantly to combatting racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia, and related intolerance. "However, there is much more work to be done and the momentum gained must be sustained," they said. They urged the General Assembly to consider proclaiming a second International Decade for People of African Descent from 2025 to 2034, "with a view to taking further action to address systemic discrimination and legacies of the past to bring

about the full recognition, justice, and development for people of African descent worldwide."

## 'Pervasive discrimination' persists

The 13 experts were appointed by the UN Human Rights Council and are not UN staff, nor are they paid for their work.

They issued their appeal on the eve of the International Day for People of African Descent. In his message for the Day, UN Secretary-General António Guterres highlighted "the enormous impact" that both the African continent and people of African descent have had on the development, diversity and richness of world civilizations and

cultures, which constitute the common heritage of humankind. "At the same time, we acknowledge the pervasive discrimination faced by people of African descent around the world, and the many obstacles they face to realising their full human rights," he said.



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# Description Of Pathomorphological Changes Of Endometriosis

## Worth Noting:

**Abstract.** In this study, pathomorphological changes of 80 internal and external endometriosis tissues examined by ARDPA in 2019-22 were studied. In this case, 90-95% internal and 5-10% external endometriosis occur, the process is 1st degree 6%, P-level 30%, Sh-level 50% and 1Y-level 14%, hyperplastic processes were observed in the endometrium in 54% of cases. Adenomyosis was noted to spread deeply in the pre-climax period, to be accompanied by endometrial hyperplasia of 2-3 degrees, and to develop with benign tumors in ¾ cases.

**Keywords:** endometriosis, adenomyosis, pathomorphological changes, hyperplastic processes, benign tumors.

### 1. Topicality

In recent years, the number of occurrences of genital endometriosis among gynecological diseases has been increasing [1,2]. In women of reproductive age, endometriosis, according to the data of various authors, is recorded in 12 - 50% and is manifested along with infertility, chronic pelvic pain syndrome, various somatic diseases [3,4,5,6,7].

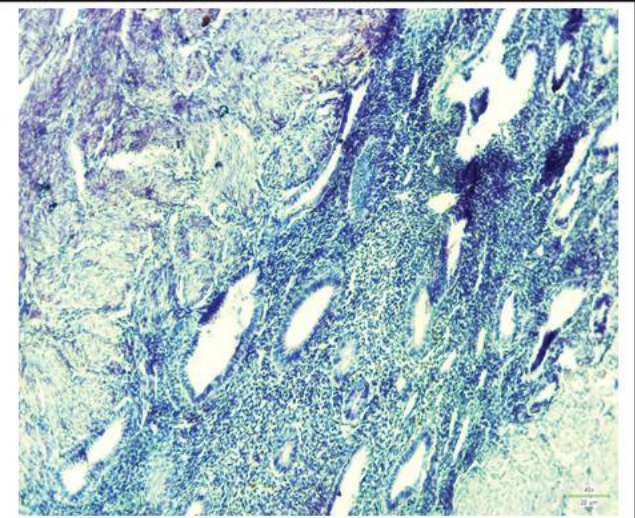
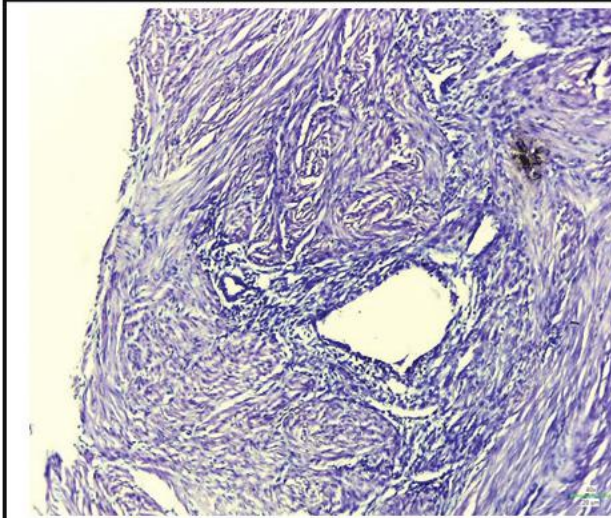

### 3. Materials and Methods

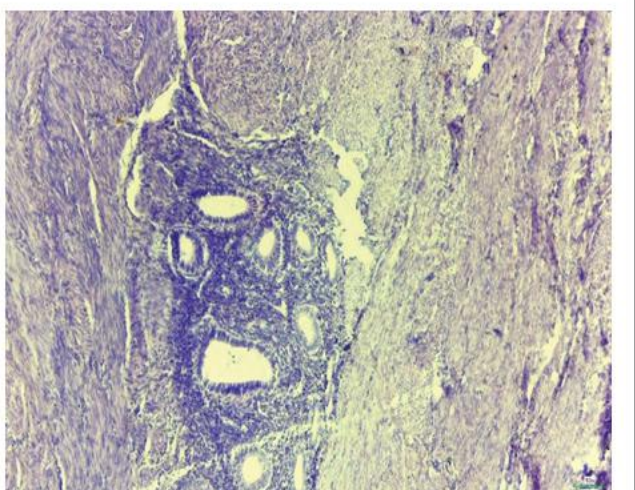
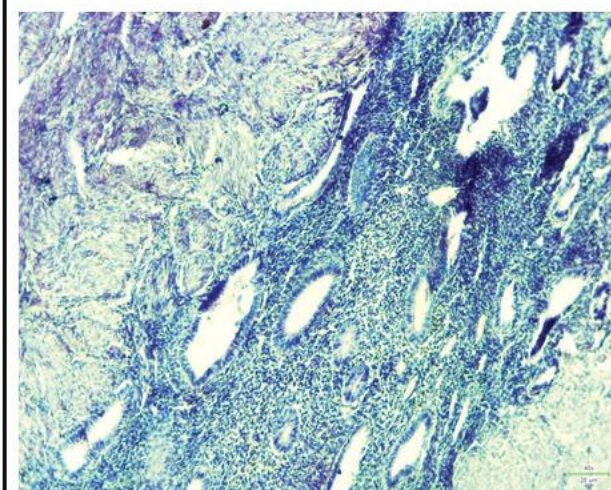
As the object of the study, 80 internal and external endometriosis tissues, which were examined in the pathology anatomy department of ASMI clinic, ARDPA, MEDICAL-PRO clinic biopsy diagnostic departments over the last 3 years, were taken, in which general morphological - hematoxylin and eosin section was studied by oil painting.

### 4. Results and Discussions

When studying the data of internal and external endometriosis tissues in the study, it was found that 90-95% internal and 5-10% external endometriosis were found. In the morphological analysis of these 80 cases, the process in the myometrial layers was 1-level 6%, P-level 30%, Sh-level 50% and 1Y-level 14%. In histological examinations of the endometrium of patients diagnosed with adenomyosis, hyperplastic processes were

observed in 54% of cases. Normal hyperplasia was detected in 86% of patients, and atypical hyperplasia in 14% of patients.

In the study, it was found that the syndromes of pain, vegetative and psycho-emotional disorders in adenomyosis develop 2-3.2 times more often than in ovarian endometriosis. In adenomyosis, pain and hemorrhagic syndromes were observed 2.1-2.8 times more often in Sh-1Y stages of the disease, and 1.9-2 times more often in hemorrhagic syndrome - glandular and glandular-stromal variants of the structure of endometrioid foci. The ratio of endometrial hyperplasia, uterine myoma and adenomyosis was 1G'1G'0.15.

Information about endometriosis, endometrioid cysts is rare in young women, and the rate of occurrence increases with age, which helps in the targeted implementation of measures for the treatment and prevention of these diseases.

In women, adenomyosis in the pre-climax period has a deep spread, 2-3 degrees, is accompanied by endometri-

al hyperplasia and develops with good-quality tumors in ¾ cases, and in the post-climax period, the degree of spread is slightly reduced, but with good-quality tumors. It was noted that the growth was parallel, and it was the basis for their clinical diagnosis.

According to the result of macroscopic examination of adenomyosis, the shape of the uterus is mostly round, the front and back surface of the organ is enlarged, the consistency is dense, and the surface looks like an uneven marble. It was found that foci were located in the thickened posterior wall in 48 (60%) cases, in the front wall in 13 (16%) cases, and in the fundus of the uterus in 39 (24%) cases. In the section of the myometrium, they were found in the form of small cysts - white tissue branches with a dense consistency, without clear borders, often with hemorrhagic content.

Diffuse form of adenomyosis was observed in 69 (86.5%) and diffuse-nodular in 11(13.5%) cases.

The diameter of endometrioid ovarian cysts varied from 0.2 to 8 cm. Cytogenic stroma in some places is wide, active, in some places it is small and sclerotized, chronic inflammatory infiltration with foci of hemorrhage, lympho-macrophage, leukocyte infiltrates was observed in them. Epithelium of cysts is cylindrical or cuboidal, secretory or proliferative type, atrophic or desquamated epithelia were observed in large cysts. Papillary growth of epithelia without cell atypia

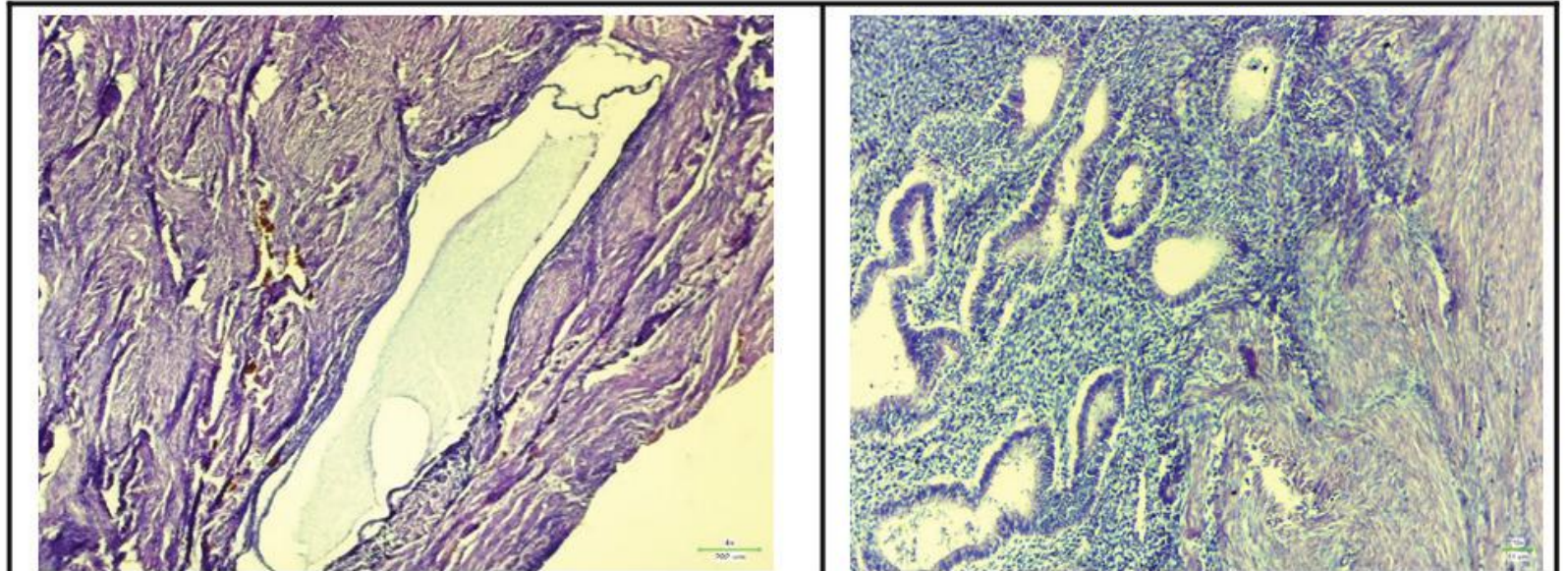

was found in some branches of large cysts. In 48 cases (>60%) cysts were expressed in the walls of the ovaries, less often (24 cases, 30%) - in the cortex or medulla of the ovaries with glandular and stromal components.

The histological structure of endometrioid foci in ovarian tissues was divided into active (glandular - stromal, stromal with active cytogenic stroma) and inactive (glandular with inactive stroma) variants.

Clinical and morphological comparisons revealed a statistically significant dependence of the frequency

of pain and hemorrhagic syndromes on the stage of adenomyosis and histological variants. Adenomyosis, pain and hemorrhagic syndromes were observed 2-3 times more often than in the 1st - P stages of the disease. Hemorrhagic syndrome was noted 2 times more often in cases with a predominant glandular component and a mixed variant than in cases with a predominant stromal component.

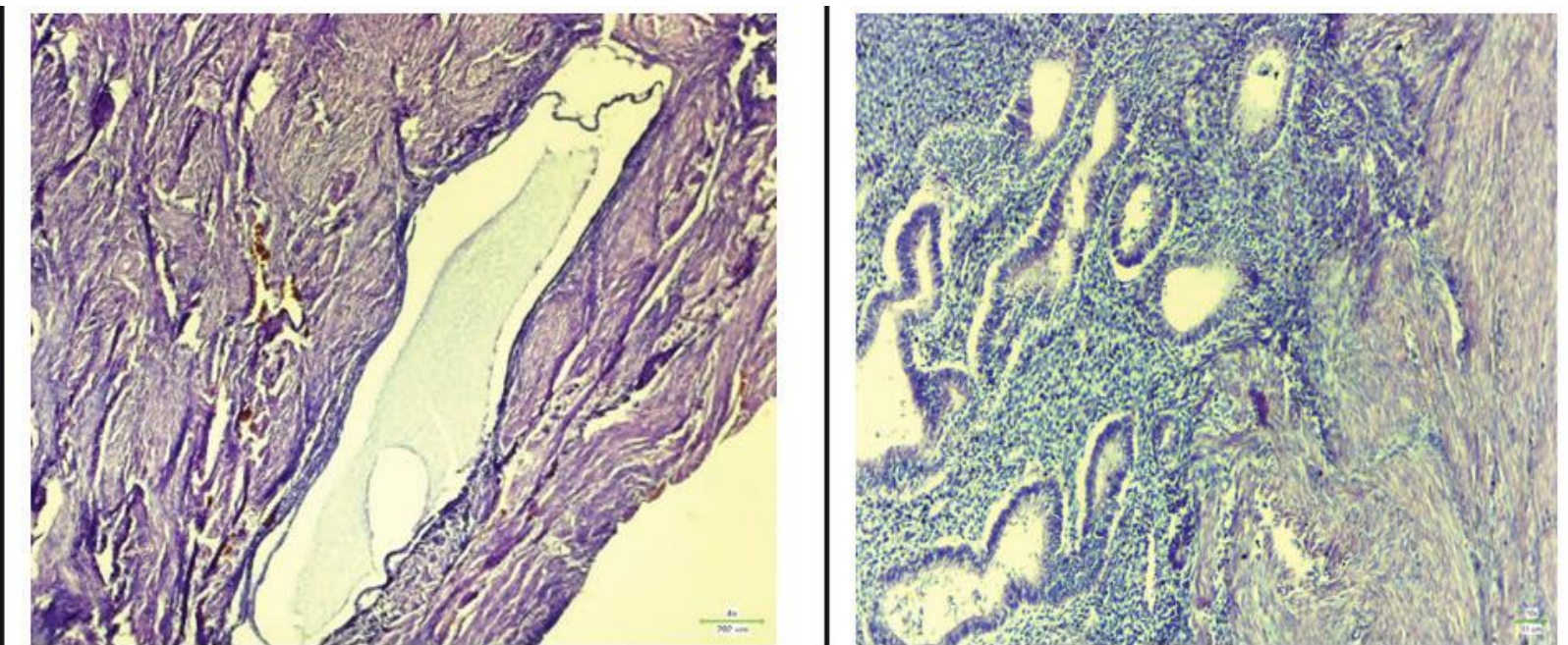
### 5. Conclusions

Endometriosis is more common in the inner, less outer, myometrial layers, the process is more P-III degree, in many cases it was manifested by simple hyperplasia of the endometrium, less often by atypical hyperplasia. Pain, vegetative

and psycho-emotional disorder syndromes, pain and hemorrhagic syndromes in adenomyosis were found to develop more than ovarian endometriosis. The ratio of endometrial hyperplasia, uterine myoma and adenomyosis was 1G'1G'0.15. Information about endometriosis, endometrioid cysts is rare in young women, and the rate of occurrence increases with age, which helps in the targeted implementation of measures for the treatment and prevention of these diseases.

# Trump pleads not guilty in Georgia election fraud case

Former US President Donald Trump has pleaded not guilty in his Georgia election fraud case, waiving the right to appear in court next week. Mr Trump is among 19 people charged with a conspiracy to overturn the US state's 2020 vote results. He turned himself in at Fulton County Jail in Atlanta last week, where he had his mugshot taken. Mr Trump has repeatedly denied any wrongdoing, describing the case as politically motivated. In total, Mr Trump faces 13 felony counts – including racketeering – for allegedly pressuring Georgia officials to reverse the results of the 2020 presidential election in that state. In a court document filed on Thursday, Mr Trump said he “fully understands” the

nature of the allegations and his right to appear in court. “Understanding my rights, I do hereby freely and voluntarily waive my right to be present at my arraignment on the indictment and my right to have it read to me in open court,” the signed document says. Mr Trump, the current frontrunner for the 2024 Republican presidential nomination, has appeared at each of his three previous arraignments. He was required to do so for the cases he is facing in New York and Florida, and opted not to request a virtual appearance for a separate case in Washington DC. In all three cases, there was tight security as Trump supporters and counter-protesters gathered near the courthouses. Mr Trump surrendered and was arraigned simultaneously in his federal court cases,

which led to his high-profile courtroom appearances. However, in Georgia state court, a defendant's surrender and arraignment usually happen separately. Brian Tevis, an Atlanta attorney who represents one of Mr Trump's co-accused, Rudy Giuliani, told CBS, the BBC's US partner, that “99% of the time” defendants who are given the option choose to waive their arraignment. Clark Cunningham, a law professor at Georgia State University, said that decision is “usually non-controversial”. “Mr Trump fully knows the charges against him,” he said. “That's the main purpose of the arraignment, to read the charges to the accused, and [to enter] the person's plea. So he doesn't need to be there, he knows what they are.” Earlier this week, three other co-defendants in the case

entered not guilty pleas, including former Trump attorneys Ray Stallings Smith and Sidney Powell, as well as former celebrity publicist Trevian Kutti. Mr Trump was originally due to be arraigned on 6 September, followed by the other defendants in 15-minute intervals. All 19 defendants in the case – including Mr Trump – are charged with violating Georgia's Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organisations Act, commonly known as the Rico act. Across the US and at the federal level, Rico laws are used to help prosecutors connect underlings who broke the law with those who gave orders or organised the crime. Fulton County's District Attorney, Fani Willis, a Democrat, has increasingly come under fire from some Republicans and Trump allies for her decision to indict Mr

Trump in the case. Earlier in August, State Senator Colton Moore sent a letter to Georgia Governor Brian Kemp, a fellow Republican, calling for a special session to impeach Ms Willis. At a Thursday news conference, Mr Kemp said he had yet to see evidence that such a move would be justified. “As long as I am governor, we're going to follow the law and the Constitution, regardless of who it helps or harms politically,” the governor said.
