# Kagumo Town Gets A Facelift In Waiguru's Cabro Project

Kagumo town in Kirinyaga county has gotten a facelift in an initiative by Governor Anne Waiguru to install cabro pavement in towns around the county.

The cabro project covering 10,000 square meters in the bustling town located in Kirinyaga Central Constituency has not only improved the town's aesthetics but has also addressed perennial discomfort that traders and town dwellers have had to cope with.

The initiative, accomplished within the last three months, has been hailed by the area residents as one of most progressive development projects that the county government has implemented in the area. The changed landscape now goes a long way in creating conducive environment for investors which will in turn to spur

economic growth in the town.

Installation of cabros in town has brought with it many benefits for the residents. It has provided adequate car parking spaces and created designated pedestrian and non-motorable pathways on both sides of the road. It has also incorporated the construction proper storm water drainage system along the road thus reducing flooding during the rainy seasons.

This initiative has lent an air of modernity to the town, attracting positive attention and fostering a sense of pride among its inhabitants.

In addition to the immediate benefits, the cabro installation has had a positive ripple effect on various aspects of daily life in Kagumo. Residents have expressed

their satisfaction and gratitude for the transformation brought about by the county government's initiative. Geoffrey Murage, a long-time resident, observed that the town looked extremely untidy and muddy during the rainy season but the situation has now changed and it is much easier to navigate around the town.

His sentiments were echoed by another resident, Martin Gatimu who noted, "Initially, there was no space for pedestrians to walk and so they competed for the road with the vehicles especially during the rains. We can now walk safely in the improved walkways even when it is rainy."

Commending governor Waiguru for the initiative.

Zipporah Muriithi, a resident and busi-

ness lady in the town also hailed the project pointing out that previously, business people had to incur losses during rainy seasons but this has changed.

"The neat, well-maintained town has now encouraged local businesses to flourish, as the improved accessibility has drawn more customers to shops and establishments in the area," she said.

Governor Anne Waiguru has reiterated her commitment to improving infrastructure across the county in a quest to provide a conducive working environment to traders in the urban centers with end goal being the improvement of livelihoods for residents.

## NEWS IN BRIEF



The annual Mt. Kenya cultural prayer pilgrimage, led by Agikuyu community elders, at Samson Corner in Kirinyaga County attracted hundreds of participants from various parts of Kenya. The pilgrims prayed facing Mount Kenya, focusing on national peace, peaceful coexistence, and successful commercial dealings. They urged people to embrace cultural prayers and fight vices like alcoholism and lifestyle diseases. The pilgrims also denounced the Shakahola religious movement, claiming it resulted from sects teaching incorrect doctrines. John Kimani Kikuyu, an elder who has attended the pilgrimage for three years, said he has seen positive impacts on his life since attending the annual pilgrimage, calling on Kenyans to embrace unity. Samuel Kamitha, the leader of the group, warned Kenyans to be wary of groups pretending to be leaders and elders of the Agikuyu community and conning people and taking their properties. The pilgrims wear blue ribbons, symbolising peace, and make the annual trip around the mountain in an anticlockwise direction, holding prayers with their hands raised while facing the mountain.



Women in Kirimari Ward, Embu County, have been encouraged to join self-help groups to benefit from a Sh10 million revolving fund initiated by the county government. Area MCA Ibrahim Swaleh emphasised that the only way for women to benefit from the scheme or other government funds is through registered self-help groups. He asked over 100 women groups to ensure their registration status was up-to-date for them to qualify for the funding once it is rolled out. Swaleh emphasised that these groups will lead to the minimization of the economic and social exclusion of women in the labour force.



Egerton University is set to hand over the rehabilitation site at the Entiyian catchment area, one of the sources of the Njoro River, to Narok County after conserving it for 11 years. The university has been spearheading rehabilitation efforts since 2012 to address the negative effects of river degradation. The university collaborated with the local Maa community and secured the river's source in Olkruto area, Narok North Sub County, and reclaimed a section at a dumpsite in Njoro Sub County. The university will hand over the two sites to the respective county governments for management and conservation in the future. Challenges faced in reclaiming the water catchment land include siltation, encroachment by the local community, and the use of planted trees for firewood. The university collaborated with partners like Co-operative Bank, KCB Bank, and media houses to rehabilitate the land. The river stretches over 60 kilometres through Neissuit, Mauche, Ngata, and Barut in Nakuru County before emptying into Lake Nakuru.



Kakamega County Governor Fernandes Barasa is implementing a plan to provide extension services and pigs to farmers to enhance food security and wealth creation in the region. The move will enable pig farmers to increase their stocks and explore markets for pig products. The governor plans to initiate a programme to provide subsidised feed and revive the pig slaughterhouse in Ikolomani Sub County, where operations had stalled due to a lack of sufficient stock. The administration will also engage investors and source markets for pig products on their behalf to enhance profits. Pig farming remains one of the most highly profitable agribusiness farm initiatives due to its productive nature. Farmers in Navakholo, Shinyalu, Ikolomani, and Lurambi sub-counties have already benefited from the distribution exercise. The subsequent distribution phase will extend to farmers in the remaining sub-counties. The governor also announced the establishment of a pig multiplication centre at the Bukura Agricultural Training Centre (ATC) through the Department of Agriculture.

Kiambu Bus Park is in the final stages of construction, with the laying of Cabro set to commence soon. The bus terminal, one of the busiest, is being rehabilitated by the Directorate of Transport to ease mobility and spur economic development. The county government has assembled road construction units equipped with county-owned machinery to reduce the overall cost of rebuilding roads.



Over 400 rural access roads within the wards have been successfully opened up and restored, and progress is evident in the ongoing tarmacking of roads across various parts of the county. Modernising and upgrading bus parks in other areas will improve public transportation and overall transport sector quality. In response to rising electricity costs, the county government has changed street lighting to solar, with approximately 18,000 solar street lights installed across the 60 wards. The county is slated to receive about Sh1.6 billion in funding from the World Bank's Kenya Urban Support Programme (KUSP), with 12 new municipal managers overseeing the municipalities. In April, the Kenyan government signed a Sh37.2 billion loan deal with China to finance the conversion of Kiambu Road into a dual carriageway to ease traffic congestion.

Kiharu MP Ndindi Nyoro has announced the government's plans to increase funding for the construction and renovation of police stations and staff quarters nationwide. Nyoro, who is also chair of the National Assembly's Budget and Appropriations committee, emphasised the need for better housing for security officers, who are tirelessly fighting crime and protecting Kenyans and their property. He emphasised the importance of the separation of police funding from the Ministry of Interior and National Administration, as it has improved service delivery in the security sector. Nyoro also urged leaders not to politicise police operations, stating that they should work independently without undue interference. He also appealed to officers manning roads to desist from soliciting bribes and allowing unworthy vehicles on the roads, as there have been increased accidents on the roads in recent times. Murang'a County Police County Commander David Mathiu said that cooperation between police and the public has reduced cases of crime during the festive season, but urged drivers to exercise maximum caution and protect their passengers.

# Acorn Development Reit Sells 630-Bed Property In Sh1.48bn Transaction, Pays Sh240mn First Dividend

The Acorn Student Accommodation Development REIT (ASA D-REIT), which is Acorn's development vehicle for student housing, has sold its latest stabilized asset, Qwetu Aberdare Heights II, to the Acorn Student Accommodation Income REIT (ASA I-REIT) in a Sh1.48 billion deal.

Through the sale of this asset, the ASA D-REIT will repay close to Sh600 million of the Acorn Green Bond bringing the total repayment to date on the Sh5.7 billion bond pro-

gram to Sh3 billion ahead of its maturity in November 2024.

The ASA I-REIT has acquired the 630-bed property located next to USIU and adjacent to Qwetu Aberdare Heights I, bringing the total number of assets acquired by the ASA I-REIT to four in the last three years.

This brings the total number of properties in the ASA I-REIT to seven, with a total bed portfolio of 4,450 beds.

Qwetu Aberdare Heights II exemplifies Acorn's dedication to providing

high-quality and affordable student accommodation, raising the total asset value of the ASA I-REIT to an impressive KES 10.5 billion.

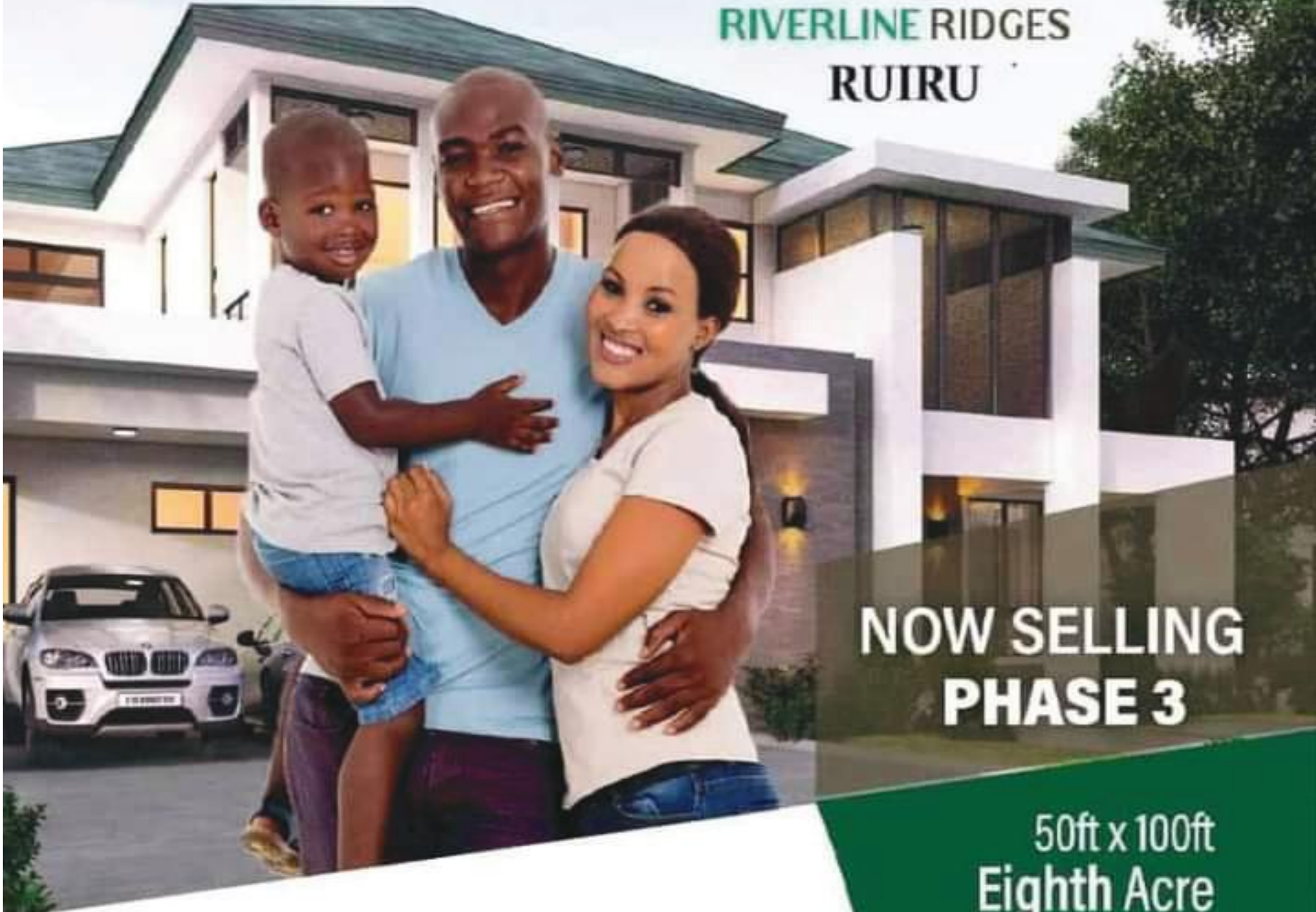

# Prepare For Future Pandemics, WHO Chief Urges In End Of Year Message

The World Health Organization (WHO) Director General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus has urged countries around the world to adequately prepare for the emergence of future pandemics.

Tedros noted that the COVID-19 pandemic marked a turning point for the world following three years of crisis, pain and loss.

“In terms of emergency preparedness and response, gaps remain in the world’s readiness to prevent the next pandemic. But 2024 offers a unique opportunity to address these gaps,” said Tedros.

The WHO Chief revealed that governments are negotiating the first-ever global agreement to protect communities, countries and the world from the threat posed by pandemics.

The Pandemic Accord is being designed to bridge the gaps in global collaboration, cooperation and equity.

“The Accord, and plans to strengthen the International Health Regulations, represent monumental actions by governments to create a safer and

healthier world,” he stated.

Tedros further highlighted 2023 as a year of “immense and avoidable suffering and threats to health” due to the ongoing Israel-Hamas war as well as the Ukraine war.

“The barbaric attacks by Hamas on Israel on the 7th of October left around 1300 people dead and over 200 taken hostage. Reports of gender-based violence and mistreatment of hostages are deplorable,” he said

“This was followed by the unleashing of a devastating attack on Gaza, which has killed more than 20,000 people – mainly women and children – and injured over 53,000,” he added.

Tedros expressed concern over impact of the crisis on hospitals and health workers have noting that as of 22 December, only 9 of 36 health facilities in Gaza were partially functional, with only four offering the most basic of services in the north.

“Without peace, there is no health, and without health there can be no peace,” he said.

Tedros also pointed out achievements such as the end of the M-POX outbreak as a global health emergency and the approval of new vaccines for malaria, dengue and meningitis, which threaten millions around the world, mainly the most vulnerable.

Azerbaijan, Tajikistan and Belize were declared malaria free, and a range of neglected tropical diseases were eliminated in multiple countries, including sleeping sickness in Ghana, trachoma in Benin, Mali and Iraq, and lymphatic filariasis in Bangladesh and Lao.

“The path to eradicating another vaccine-preventable disease – polio – has reached its last mile. Thirty more

countries introduced the HPV vaccine as the world advances toward eliminating cervical cancer,” he said.

He said there was need to address the health impacts of the climate crisis noting that for the first time, health issued featured prominently on the agenda of COP28 held in Dubai, where global declaration was issued on climate and health.

Additionally, Heads of State at the

United Nations General Assembly committed to advance universal health coverage, end tuberculosis and protect the world from future pandemics.

“Each of these achievements, and many more, demonstrated the power of science, solutions and solidarity to protect and promote health,” he stated.

# NTSA Directs Motorists To Validate eCitizen Accounts

The National Transport and Safety Authority has directed motorists to validate their eCitizen accounts ahead of the migration of its services to the platform.

In a statement, NTSA said the move aligns with the directive to migrate all government services to the eCitizen platform.

“NTSA is diligently progressing to onboard all its services to the platform. This move aims to centralize access to services through a unified portal, thereby enhancing service delivery to motor vehicle owners and other stakeholders,” the statement

read.

To facilitate the transition, the authority said the TIMS portal will be shut down from Friday, December 29, 2023 midnight to Monday, January 1, 2024 midnight.

“During this period, all NTSA online service access will be integrated with eCitizen platform single sign on in preparation for the Go-live on Tuesday, 2nd January 2024,” NTSA revealed.

“All clients with pending transactions on the TIMS platform are therefore required to complete their application by Friday 15th December 2023 to avoid any inconveniences. From Tuesday, 2nd January 2024, only eCitizen login credentials (username and Password) shall be used to access NTSA services.”



# DP Cautions Youth Against Joining Mungiki, Engaging In Alcoholism

Deputy President Rigathi Gachagua yesterday hosted more than 8,000 youth at his residence in Mathira, Nyeri county, for Christmas where he urged them to be cautious against attempts to be recruited into the outlawed Mungiki gang and avoid engaging in abuse of toxic alcohol and drugs.

The Deputy President was emphatic that the government will not allow the resurgence of the criminal outfit that is Mungiki, warning that stern action will be taken against those attempting to revive the banned group. "There were recent attempts to revive the criminal group. Please don't agree and don't join the outlawed group. Do not allow yourselves to be misused by people who want to revive proscribed groups. The government will also not allow the resurgence," said Mr Gachagua who was accompanied by his wife Pastor Dorcas Rigathi.

He stated that the people behind attempts to revive the proscribed criminal group were driving their agenda through radio and television interviews, as well as youth meetings disguised as conferences.

The Deputy President who since Christmas day has hosted hundreds of his neighbourhood including children on Tuesday, explained that his meeting with the young people was to celebrate victory and success in the government's war against alcoholism and illicit brews in Central Kenya.

"We had a challenge on alcoholism and illicit brews menace in Central Kenya and the country at large. President Ruto instructed me to lead war against the alcoholism because we were almost losing a generation in Central Kenya. This party is to celebrate victory in war against drugs abuse and alcoholism. We are 70 per cent successful and the chiefs and police officers have been instructed to deal with the remaining 30 per cent," he stated.

He added, "I feel proud that our community is back, children are being born and we have expectant women and our community is growing".

Before the government started the crackdown on illicit brews, he said, families were breaking down and population in the region was dwindling because young men were consuming poisonous and illicit drinks.

"We are now building families and homes. Men are back home taking

responsibility for their families and children. We can't do that while drunk and sleeping in trenches. Our celebration today is that young men are marrying, creating families and siring children," he said.

In his remarks, the Deputy President told the youth that in Mungiki's hey days members of the sect killed, maimed, raped women and extorted business persons.

He said such actions can not happen under Kenya Kwanza administration as he condemned the individuals behind the bid for return of the group.

The Deputy President added that the individuals attempting to revive the criminal gang recently held a meeting dubbed men's conference, which was a recruitment drive disguised as a normal meeting.

Mr Gachagua's remarks come one month after female parliamentarians from Mt Kenya region raised alarm over the resurgence of the illegal group and sanitising of its activities; a move that they said was instilling fear among women.

"I am happy our youth are law abiding, obedient and have resisted the attempts to join the criminal gangs. As government, we are working hard to address the issues affecting the youth such as unemployment, entrepreneurship and reforming agricultural sector. The youth are the future of the nation and so we must protect them and address their plights," he said as he asked the

youth not to lose hope.

The youth had a luncheon with the Deputy President and were entertained by a group of musicians led by Mugithi artists Samidoh Muchoki.

On the fight against alcoholism, the Deputy President said government is protecting the youth to secure the future of the country.

"The village chiefs and national government administrators need to protect young people. I commend the chiefs and police officers for eradicating the illicit brews. Though the national government administration officers are at work fighting the alcoholism menace, we also have a responsibility as individuals," he said.

The youth praised the Deputy President describing him as a visionary leader.

They commended him for convening the meeting and providing a platform for to engage, learn and grow.

"We discussed the opportunities of economic development and growth. We have been apprised about the war against alcoholism and opportunities in the business sector. It was indeed an inspiration to us," said David Kamau from Nanyuki, Laikipia county.

# DPP Ingonga Says He Has Not Received Inquiry File On Murder Of Meru Blogger

The Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) Renson Ingonga says he has not received the inquiry file on the murder of Meru blogger Daniel Muthiani commonly known as Sniper.

In a statement, the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) stated that the DPP shall give appropriate directions once he receives the file.

“Following the recovery of the abducted person, the ODPP directed the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) to undertake investigations into the offence of murder and submit the resultant inquiry file for perusal and further directions,”

Muthiani’s body was found dumped in Mutonga River in Tharaka Nithi County on December 16, 2023.

A postmortem examination conducted by government pathologist Johansen Oduor at the Marimanti

Level 4 hospital Mortuary in Tharaka Nithi, Meru County revealed that he died after being strangled.

Sniper’s body had marks on his neck, he had fractured ribs and showed injuries on his head which suggested that he was strangled and he exhibited signs of a person who had lacked oxygen.

Once constructed, the State assures the developers it will buy in bulk all houses.

This will be done at prevailing market rates and so they will rake in good profits.

Yes, the deductions are compulsory and this does not mean as a contributor you will lose your money. You are free to withdraw your money after seven years. But this changed after public participation as majority of Kenyans rooted for the conversion of the fund to tax

Why Housing plan is a good idea? In Kenya, 65 percent of Kenyan population, who had migrated to Urban areas, live in slums.

Here the living conditions are deplorable: No water, no toilets, no electricity. The area is also filthy, with poor drainage and hence prone to communicable diseases. The crime rate is also very higher.

As I conclude, allow me to say this. Many countries across the world which had adopted similar plan of Affordable Housing Programme have had success stories.

One of them Singapore, a middle income economy.

Today, 90 percent of the population in this country lives in decent houses constructed by the government in partnership with private developers.

I'm sure those who have read our constitution would agree with me. Shelter is one of the basic human rights. When people live in deplorable conditions, this hinders thier contribution to economic growth.

So, Ruto's Housing Plan is a move in right direction. It is a show of his commitment to rebuilding our economy. Let us support him.

# Electrical Fault Caused Explosion On Oil Ship In Mombasa – KPA

The Kenya Ports Authority has issued a statement regarding an explosion that occurred inside an oil ship docked at the African Marine Terminal in Liwatoni on Tuesday afternoon.

Confirming the incident, KPA stated that the likely cause of the fire on the ship, christened East Wind II, was an electrical fault.

According to the authority, the ship was lying alongside a privately owned African Marine General Engineering Company (AMGECO) ship repair yard when the incident happened.

“KPA Harbour Tug Simba III that is equipped with firefighting capability contained the fire by 1235hrs nearly an hour after the incident was reported by the master of the ship to the KPA control tower. The instant response by the tugboat and fire brigade on the shore side ensured nor-

malcy,” the statement reads in part.

However, the explosion resulted in one minor head injury to a crew member who was on deck watch and was rushed to hospital, where he is in stable condition.

East Wind II reportedly offloaded fuel in Zanzibar before transiting through the Port.

KPA Managing Director Captain William Ruto commended the crew of Tug simba III for successfully containing the fire.

“The fire brigade continued to monitor the situation where they left at around 1450hrs after confirming the situation was normalised and safe,” he said.

# KeNHA Announces Temporary Closure Of Sothern Bypass From Yesterday

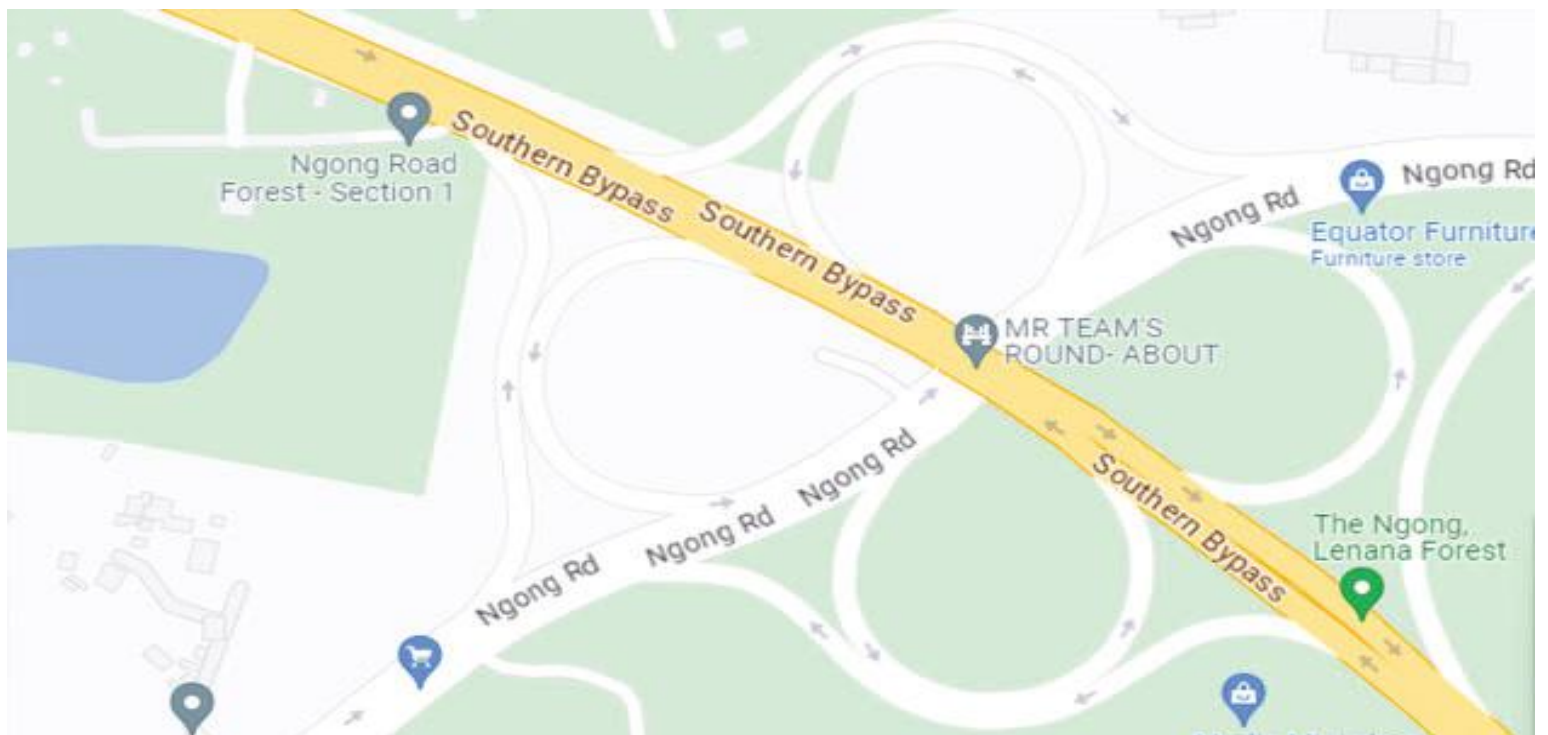

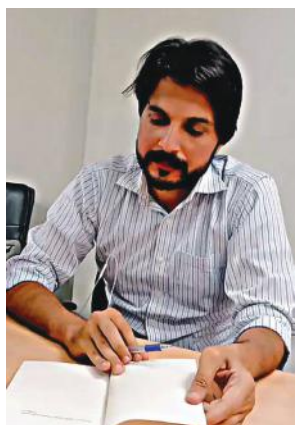
# Working With Applications: Analysis And Results



The National Center for Human Rights of the Republic of Uzbekistan has an effective system for working with appeals from the population. The department dealing with the appeals of individuals and legal entities is mainly engaged in the activities in this regard. By the decision of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated December 10, 2018, the Center is responsible for: receiving representatives of individuals and legal entities, considering their appeals; implementation of monitoring and analysis of the resolution of appeals; direct study on the ground of the activities of state bodies, law enforcement structures, including the practice of ensuring human rights in penal institutions; concerned state bodies and organizations are assigned the task of making recommendations on ensuring the observance of human rights and the restoration of violated rights and freedoms of citizens. In the past period of 2022, the center received more than 900 applications for implementation. So far, more than a quarter of these considered appeals have been resolved positively. When the appeals are analyzed from the point of view of their origin, the majority of appeals come from the city of Tashkent, Tashkent, Kashkadarya and Samarkand regions. The analysis shows that most of the applications received this year are the same as in previous years: administration of justice; from court decisions;

preliminary investigative actions and the decisions of the responsible persons who conducted them; dissatisfaction with the decisions of local state authorities; consists of appeals on land allocation and rights to housing. It is known that, based on the requirements set forth in Article 9 of the Law "On Appeals of Individuals and Legal Entities", reception of individuals and representatives of legal entities in the Center is held on the specified days and hours, according to the admission schedule. About 30 percent of the appeals received by the Center during the analyzed period are appeals received during the personal admission process. At this point, a legitimate question arises: what needs to be done to ensure citizens' trust in courts and law enforcement agencies? For this, in the words of President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, the constitutional principle of the priority of human rights and freedoms must be unconditionally ensured in the daily activities of state bodies. Therefore, "Man, his value, rights and freedoms are the highest value." This principle means that every enterprise, organization, institution should direct its activities to ensure human rights and legal interests. dignity". PF- In accordance with Decree No. 6196, further development of the system of public safety in our country and promising directions of state policy in this field were determined.

Individuals and groups, taken separately, may conflict over material things, basic relationships and values, powers of authority, and so on. In any field of activity, conflict can arise due to differences and interests.

Conflicts have a negative impact not only on human activity and value, but also on group and interpersonal relations, quality of education, work efficiency, etc.

Researcher V.M. According to Karimov, conflicts are the competition or opposition of two opposing desires. One of the urgent tasks of modern psychology is to prevent disagreements, determine the nature of conflicts, classify types of conflicts, and develop a methodological system for conflict resolution.

From this point of view, this theoretical research, which attracts our attention, is of significant importance.

Psychological conflicts are explained by differences in the interests, needs and opinions of the parties. And on the basis of these contradictions, conflicts arise. How-

By the decision of the President of Uzbekistan on January 20, the code of professional culture and service discipline of the employees of internal affairs bodies was approved. The text of the decision was placed on the national database of legislative information - Lex.uz.

According to the document, knowledge of the code and strict observance of its rules is mandatory for every employee of the agency, and the code is the main criterion for evaluating the efficiency and discipline of the employee.

Failure to comply with the Code may result in disciplinary action against the employee, including dismissal.

- The teacher must not forget that he is an active participant in the process of pedagogical communication. That is why it is necessary to continuously acquire a number of qualities of pedagogical skills in his professional activity.

- First of all, a teacher should be thoughtful, accurate, able to correctly assess any pedagogical situation and be able to independently resolve existing conflicts.

Based on the above requirements, a modern pedagogue should be a highly cultured, eloquent, student-loving, kind, creative, well-versed in his subject, a psychologist, capable of using modern techniques. The teacher is the engineer of the child's heart.

Teaching is a highly honorable profession. This profession is not like any other profession. The famous Russian pedagogue A.S. Makarenko gives a very high assessment of the teaching profession and defines it as follows: „An educator must know how to organize, walk, joke, be cheerful or angry, he should behave in such a way that his every action, behavior, and dress should educate the children”. From this definition, it can be concluded that a pedagogue should be perfect in every way, an ideal person for students. Even the dress of the teacher should educate the children.

It is appropriate for teachers to pay attention to clear and concise expression of their opinion in the process of communication with students, parents and colleagues. In the process of dealing with them, it is necessary not to start the conversation with evidence of negative situations, but on the contrary, to recognize the successes of students (or colleagues, parents), and to express confidence in further enriching them. In the process of communication, benevolence, sincerity, friendly attitude, and good mood should be felt from the words of the teacher towards the interlocutor. ensures that it gains attention.

The scientific and theoretical foundations of the formation of pedagogical skills in the teacher were presented by pedagogue scientist V.A. Also studied by Slastyonin. He talks about professional - pedagogical training,

the direction of the teacher's personality and professional formation, and pedagogical skill in this, and writes: "a teacher acquires teaching skill only if he regularly relies on pedagogical theories. Because, pedagogical practice requires constant reference to pedagogical theory.

It is worth it if we scatter bouquets at their feet, always pay their respects and honor them. ## Hojlund Ends Goal Drought As United Fight Back To Beat Villa

Rasmus Hojlund capped Manchester United's thrilling fightback from two goals down as the Denmark striker netted for the first time in the Premier League to seal a dramatic 3-2 win against Aston Villa on Tuesday.

Erik ten Hag's side were in danger of another damaging defeat when goals from John McGinn and Leander Dendoncker put Villa in control by half-time at Old Trafford.

United were booed off at the interval but they staged a much-needed revival, sparked by Alejandro Garnacho scoring their first goal in seven hours and twenty minutes.

Garnacho struck again to equalise before Hojlund finally ended his goal drought with eight minutes left.

It was Hojlund's maiden league goal for United in his 15th ap-

pearance and his sixth in all competitions since his August move from Atalanta.

Hojlund's cathartic strike ended United's four-match winless run in all competitions and lifted them to sixth in the Premier League.

Two games without a win have dented Villa's unexpected title challenge.

Unai Emery's men remain third, three points behind leaders Liverpool after their first defeat in 11 matches in all competitions.

United's dismal 2-0 loss at West Ham had left them with 13 defeats in all competitions this term, their most before Christmas since 1930.

That wretched run had increased the pressure on Ten Hag, who was perceived to be fighting to convince British billionaire Jim Ratcliffe to keep faith with him.

Ratcliffe agreed to buy a 25 per cent stake in United for £1.03 billion (\$1.3 billion) on Christmas Eve.

INEOS director of sport Dave Brailsford was in the Old Trafford directors box in the first sign of Ratcliffe's investment.

Brailsford's mantra was "marginal gains" during his time in charge of the British Cycling team, making this hard-fought success a vital step in Ten Hag's bid to avoid the sack.

- Hojlund redemption -

United's flaws were on full display when they fell behind in typically sloppy fashion after 21 minutes.

When Bruno Fernandes gave away a needless free-kick, McGinn's inswinging delivery from the right flank should have been cleared.

But United keeper Andre Onana

and his defenders were flat-footed as the ball arrowed into the far corner untouched.

United were guilty of more woeful defending in the 26th minute as Clement Lenglet was left unmarked to head McGinn's corner into the six-yard box, where Dendoncker back-heeled a deft finish past Onana for his first Villa goal. Boos rained down on United's players as Ten Hag stood ashen-faced on the touchline.

Marcus Rashford was making his first United start for six games since early December after scoring only twice this term.

Rashford squandered a good chance to reduce the deficit when he shot too close to Emiliano Martinez, who palmed away another blast from the forward before half-time.

United desperately needed a goal early in the second half and Garnacho delivered in the 59th minute as he tapped in Rashford's low cross.

Onana made a crucial save from Leon Bailey's volley to keep United afloat and Ten Hag's men made of the most of the reprieve as they snatched an equaliser in the 71st minute.

Fernandes's cross was deflected into Garnacho's path and the winger's strike from 10 yards hit Diego Carlos as it flashed past Martinez.

United defender Jonny Evans cleared McGinn's shot off the line, setting the stage for Hojlund's moment of redemption.

A United corner deflected off McGinn towards Hojlund, who swivelled to caress a sweet volley in off the post, sparking wild celebrations from the Dane and his team-mates as Ten Hag breathed a sigh of relief.

# Liverpool Go Top As Nunez Ends Drought To Sink Burnley

Liverpool climbed to the top of the Premier League as Darwin Nunez ended his goal drought to inspire a 2-0 win against struggling Burnley on Tuesday. Jurgen Klopp's side took an early lead through Nunez at Turf Moor and held on despite wasting a host of chances. Nunez's eighth goal this season was his first for 12 games since he netted against Bournemouth in the League Cup on November 1. Diogo Jota, back from a month's injury absence, wrapped up the victory late on to leave Liverpool two points above second placed Arsenal, who have a game in hand. Third placed Aston Villa would move level on points with Liverpool, behind them on goal difference, if they beat Manchester United later on Tuesday. Arsenal can regain top spot with a victory at home to West Ham on

Thursday. After successive draws with Manchester United and Arsenal prior to Christmas, this was an essential victory for Liverpool's title ambitions. Chasing a first title since 2020, the Reds still aren't at their flowing best, but what they lack in grace they make up for in grit at present. Second bottom Burnley are five points from safety, but it could have different if Zeki Amdouni had given them a shock lead when he raced through the middle for a wayward shot that whistled wide in the opening seconds. In their final game of 2023, Liverpool took advantage of that escape in the sixth minute as Cody Gakpo teed up Nunez and he curled a fine finish into the far corner from 20 yards. Gakpo should have doubled Liverpool's lead when he blasted

wastefully over from a good position inside the area. Burnley's Josh Brownhill forced Alisson Becker to make a good save with a testing long-range strike. But Liverpool were always in the ascendency and Harvey Elliott had a shot well saved by Trafford before Gakpo's powerful finish was disallowed for Nunez's foul on Charlie Taylor in the build-up. As they searched for a second goal, Liverpool went close again as Mohamed Salah hit the bar with a fierce strike from Joe Gomez's pass. Wataru Endo's low drive from the edge of the area was pushed away at full-stretch by Trafford. The over-worked Trafford was keeping Burnley from being demolished as he made another good stop to keep out Salah's curler. Elliott thought he had scored in the 55th minute with a cushioned

finish from Ryan Gravenberch's cross, but the goal was ruled out after a VAR check showed Salah was offside. Dara O'Shea's flick almost provided Burnley with an equaliser against the run of play as the ball bounced off Nunez and looped just over. Suddenly, Liverpool looked a little vulnerable Johann Gudmundsson squandered a golden opportunity when he headed Wilson's Odobert's cross over from close-range. Burnley's final fling came when Jacob Bruun Larsen drilled inches wide after Endo's mistake. In the 90th minute, Portugal forward Jota delivered the knockout blow, firing home from an acute angle inside the area for his 50th Liverpool goal.
