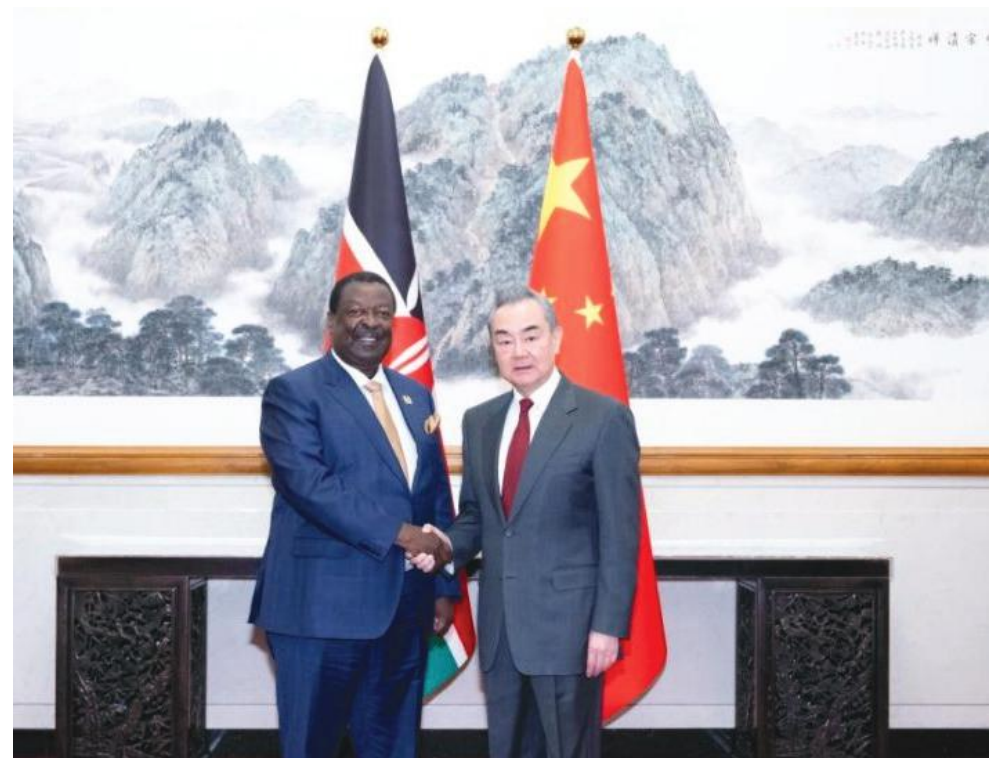

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FGM Features Strongly Among Issues Slowing Down The Development Of Kuria Women

The Kuria East MP listed five issues slowing down the development of the Kuria girls and women, and female genital mutilation (FGM) featured strongly despite the calls by local and international organisations against the practice.

Speaking during a widows meeting convened by the spouse of the Deputy President, Pastor Dorcas Rigathi at Happy Church Kehancha, Cathedral yesterday, the MP Marwa Kemero, said that the challenges facing girls and women start early in life.

“First girls in Kuria go to school late as they are the ones who work at home fetching firewood, water, cooking, and going to the posho mill. As a result, most of them go to school late, and others never go at all.”

“Then, the season of FGM comes, and the girl undergoes the right, which ends up affecting their future life. And in the event the husband dies early, we end up with very young uneducated widows,” said MP Kemero.

The MP asked Pastor Dorcas to assist in promoting the education of the girls of the Kuria community.

“Help us with the education of the Kuria girl. That is our biggest challenge, even as you connect the widow in Kenya with the other women in Kenya,” said MP Kemero.

Pastor Dorcas was shocked by the huge turn out of the widows who attended the meeting, some seemingly very young, a concern she expressed in her speech. More than 500 women attended the

meeting.

“I am angered by what the devil is doing. All these are widows, even very young widows,” she said.

Pastor Dorcas, who believes in the power of prayer, spent a huge part of her speech time to pray and anoint all the widows and women who attended the meeting in the belief that ‘the anointing breaks, and destroys the yoke’, which is the yoke of widowhood.

“The tears of widows shall end. This land shall not be a land of the widowed, but of the married. The tears of widows shall end,” said Pastor Dorcas.

She also shared her story of being brought up by a widow to encourage the hundreds of widows at the meeting, that their children and other dependents

should not resign to a life of lack and hopelessness. There is always hope in life.

First Lady Agnes Ochillo said that Pastor Dorcas was God sent to work, and empower the widows in Kuria, and she would work with her office for the success of her programs.

Pastor Dorcas and her office has worked with widows in Nairobi, Kajiado, Njoro, and plans are underway to kickstart work with widows in Embu where she visited last week, and now Kuria.

Kenya’s Governor, Simba Arati, has endorsed 2,841 Community Health Promoters (CHPs) to provide health services closer to households. He distributed kits with items like mobile phones to improve the scope and quality of CHPs’ services. Arati emphasized that investing in the community yields economic and societal benefits, making CHPs a sustainable way to achieve Universal Health Coverage at a minimum cost. The county has 100% community coverage, with 2,940 CHPs supporting 294 community units. Arati praised the National Government for procuring the kits and mobile phones, which will facilitate the digital community health information system and enhance the capacity of CHPs to collect, collate, and report community health data in real-time.



Kisumu County Government has partnered with Safaricom to launch the Integrated County Revenue Management System (ICRMS), a cashless platform for residents to access and pay for county services. The system aims to enhance accessibility, transparency, and boost the county’s Own Source Resource collection regime. It is available on Safaricom App, Mobile App, and WhatsApp, and features real-time verification of transactions and payments.



The Ministry of Health has issued a cautionary alert over a suspected viral conjunctivitis outbreak in Mombasa county.

In a statement Thursday evening, the Ministry noted that there was an upsurge of possible viral conjunctivitis cases in the coastal county and urged locals to exercise caution, amid ongoing tests lab investigations to ascertain its cause.

“The cases are very contagious and are presenting with red eyes, eye swelling, eye discharge, and itchiness,” warned the Ministry

According to the Ministry, conjunctivitis can be caused by infections and chemicals.

“Take preventive measures such as washing hands, using sanitizers, maintaining hygiene. Seek prompt treatment and self-isolate if symptomatic,” the Ministry advised



Government is distributing 15.3 million Long-lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLINs) in 22 high-burden counties to reduce malaria cases. The Ministry of Health, with support from the Global Fund and the U.S. President’s Malaria Initiative, aims to cover 91% of registered households. The campaign will begin with data validation, county and sub-county sensitization, and training of healthcare workers.

Laikipia rancher Lucy Wambui Jennings, who was shot by unknown assailants in Rumuruti area on Sunday has passed on. Jennings died yesterday morning while undergoing treatment at Pope Benedict XIV Hospital in Nyahururu. According to his brother Njihia Mbugua, the deceased had been receiving treatment while at the hospitals ICU, but her condition worsened in the wee hours of Thursday, when she breathed her last. She also has been visiting prisons to talk to the inmates. Today, she is also set to lead the inmates of Kendege Prison in a tree-planting exercise.

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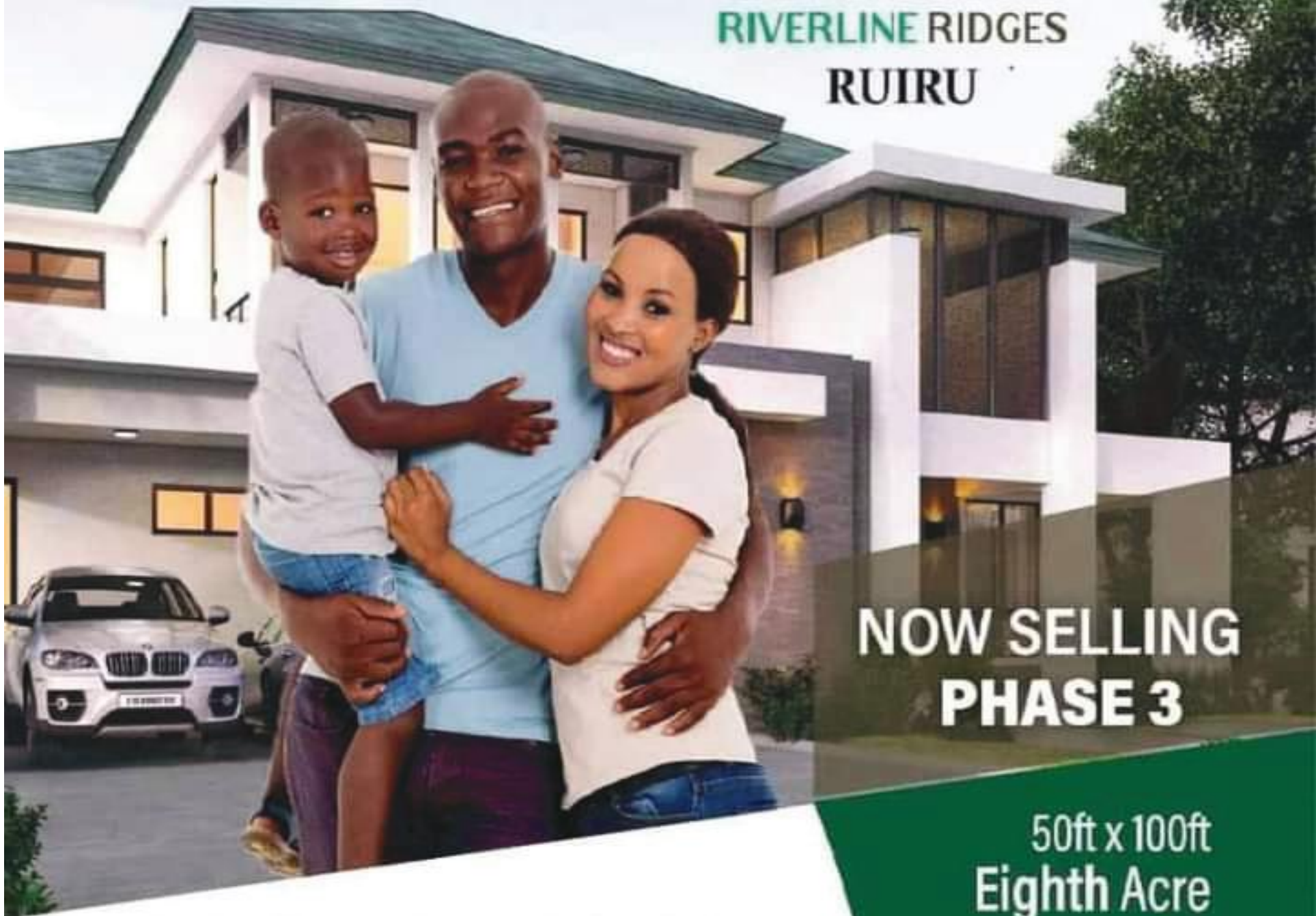

A few days ago, I read a statement issued by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank.

The Bretton Wood Institution had taken issue with President William Ruto for turning deaf ear to some of conditionalities they had imposed on Kenya.

They singled out the fuel subsidy. After assuming office, we held some discussions with Kenyan head of state. He agreed to remove the subsidies on food, fuel and other essential commodities. He has now reinstated them.

Here, the Bretton Wood opted to mislead Kenyans.

President Ruto had not changed his position.

On food security, he has since lived to his word of subsidizing the crop production and value additions.

The procurement and supply of the low cost fertilizer was one of the key interventions.

On petroleum products, he advised the Ministry of Energy to use Fuel Development Fund (FDF) to stabilize the prices.

Looking at the President's interventions, one thing is clear. He has not been singing the song of IMF and World Bank parse. He always put the interest of Kenyans first. This explains why the Bretton wood was not comfortable with him.

So, for me, the critics claim that President William Ruto had surrendered his authority to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank did not hold any water.

Beside the removal of subsidies, the

privatization of state corporations also stood out as one of the key pledges that Dr William Ruto, Kenya Kwanza presidential candidate, made during campaigns.

As we know, the rules governing IMF and World Bank requires the two institutions to engage the sitting President. So, the critics' claims were cheap, hollow and misplaced. President Ruto is implementing what he promised Kenyans.

Yes, IMF headquarter is in America and the President has made a number of trips to that country.

It is also true that President Ruto has been holding talks with the President of IMF.

You cannot however use this as a basis of making such claims.

The recent social media reports have been alleging that Dr Ruto has so far signed up foreign loans worth billions of shillings.

In most cases, the critics would come out of blue to publish these alarming claims.

They would not tell us where they got this information.

As a way of fooling the masses, they would feature a photo of the Kenyan head of state and the President of IMF taken a long time ago.

Ruto's critics would further allege. Ruto said during the campaigns that his administration will never go for foreign loans.

Today, he is doing the opposite. He had borrowed more than his predecessor. I would call this a big lie because they

were yet to provide any documentary evidence. I would have expected them to do a scientific and well-researched comparative analysis.

What Dr Ruto meant during the campaign is that he will reduce in a big way the insatiable appetite for borrowing foreign loans that was the hallmark of the previous administration.

He has kept his word. The money that his administration has borrowed so far is a drop in the ocean. Opposition leaders have exaggerating figures for obvious reasons.

It is worth noting that the IMF and World Bank have been partnering with many countries across the world.

In Kenya, the two institutions have been working together with the leaderships of the successive governments of Independent Kenya. This is on matters of resuscitation of economy and development.

During President Moi's era, the public opinion was divided. Some supported the conditionalities and others argued Bretton wood had imposed bitter pill.

President Moi had formed a team, dubbed the Dream Team, to coordinate and oversee the implementation of the SAPS. The team was led by Richard Leakey.

Besides, William Ruto's predecessors Mwai Kibaki and Uhuru Kenyatta have had engagements with Bretton Wood Institutions. This heralded in accepting the loans they offered and conditionalities attached.

Each administration would also prioritize on the issue of enhancing and ex-

panding tax collection base. This is by drafting and enacting tax regime to fast track the process. President Kibaki is the one who had coined a slogan 'Kulipa Ushuru Ni Kujitegemea'.

A day had been set aside to celebrate and reward Kenyans who paid their full taxes on time, thus complying with tax laws and regulations. Just like Ruto, Kibaki and Uhuru would mince no in calling on tax man to pursue tax defaulters. Every Kenyan must pay their taxes.

Some of Uhuru's meetings with Bretton Wood were held in US.

He had also made numerous trips to the USA. At one point, it dawned on President Uhuru that the economy was doing badly.

In the meantime, the Bretton Institutions were piling pressure on him to allow them to intervene. He had no option but to succumb.

So, President Ruto took over at a time when the IMF and World Bank had already rolled out their prescriptions. His predecessor had signed them. It is therefore hard for Dr Ruto to get out. Uhuru is one who had been held hostage. Ruto is working hard to undo this.

He has so far made great strides towards rebuilding of our economy. He knows this is only way that can make them leave our country on their own volition.

Mental Health Condition In Kenya Today

Depression and stress has today become a common illness that affects many Kenyans. It does not have an exception, individuals from all ages and backgrounds experience it. Statistics have shown that at least 25% outpatient and 40% inpatients attended to in different facilities have a mental illness. The most frequent diagnosis is depress, stress, anxiety as well as substance abuse disorder, which varies in severity.

According to WHO report 2014, Kenya was ranked 4th country with 1.9 million people having a condition. It is also reported that these cases rise rapidly. Good health is key to happiness and overall wellbeing. However, my research as an author has led me to conclude that many Kenyans do not have much knowledge and information on what mental health is as well as what mental illnesses are. They are unable to differentiate the two.

Mental health is cognitive, behavioral, and emotional well-being. It

affects how we think, feel, and act while mental illnesses are conditions that affect your wellbeing. It also affects how an individual perceives the world around them as well as how they think and behave.

Mental wellness really determines overall health and socio-economic development of country. It influences community cohesion, work productivity, interactions among people, employment and earnings as well as improved quality life among others.

However, the country faces challenges in mental health management in the following ways;

The cost of treating mental health illness is very expensive in Kenya making it inaccessible to the millions of people who need assistance. Equally, there are less mental health practitioners. For instance, there are 100 psychiatrists and many of them are located within Nairobi. The rest are dispersed one psychiatrist per population making their services scarce.

Ignorance due to lack of information also contributes a lot to poor help seeking behaviors. This could be summed up by stigma and discrimination too on matters to do



with mental health. Majority of individuals especially in rural areas do not really explore this topic. To be specific, men keep quiet about it in a bid to avoid being vulnerable and as a way of upholding masculinity. Schools are embracing wellness talks but the counselling departments are barely utilized.

It will be important for all health stakeholders to take up mental health as a serious health issue. They

need to undertake intensive awareness campaigns on the condition, prevention, early symptoms and management and treatment services. The Government should also allocate more funding to mental health services and train health workers at all levels to manage and treat mental Health Challenges. At the community level, grassroots advocacy present both opportunity for empowerment towards demystifying stigma and

influencing policy through ground up advocacy to effectively address the challenge. This needs engaging the community and the society as a whole.

Former Kenya’s Chief Justice Dr. Willy Mutunga has joined voices with other concerned Kenyans following the launch of Chinese Property Developers Association in Nairobi last week.

According to the association, they aim to boost property development in the country.

The Association’s President Zhang Jiaping said the association has been established as a platform that will act as a bridge to serve society and benefit humanity.

However, many are reading from a different script with suspicions that there could be more into it than what the Chinese are saying.

“Nairobi has been auctioned off to the highest bidder under the “solicitous” gaze of Governor Johnson Sakaja.” Jerotich Seii, human rights activist says.

“The Chinese Association will turn whatever is left of the Green City in the Sun into a vast, unrecognizable jungle of high rise, concrete tenements that will enrich their Chinese shareholders and Kenyan surrogates, all the while destroying our children’s future.” She sounded the alarm.

She accuses the Chinese of operating with impunity in the country disregarding ethics laws.

“The Chinese Property Developers Association and their ilk fear no one – probably not even the law – and laugh at Nairobians because they know that the top leadership, including

the Governor, already backs them. They will continue to exploit “grey areas” in spite of clear zoning regulations, environmental codes NEMA and constitutionally enshrined public participation requirements. They will despite their assertions – continue to hide behind architects and contractors who allegedly grease palms as needed aka the-cost-of-doing-business-in-Kenya. Their demarche on Nairobi is akin to a melting iceberg and I want to believe that we will wake up before we drown.”

In echoing her sentiments, Dr. Mutunga said, “Xi Jinping tells the world that China is different from the West. Like the West China does not respect our Constitution. Until we realize how enslaved our corrupt political leadership and the leadership of our institutions are we will lose our country.”

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Okawo Nashon, a real estate expert in Nairobi has termed the association as a joke and insult to the professionals in the country, “it is a shameful joke that should be condemned and resisted. So what will be next; Chinese Engineers Association? Italians

Contractors Association? Or Mongolian Architects Association? Why not join the well established Kenya Property Developers Association? What is so special about these Chinese developers? We want sanity in this industry not some entitled people out to kick the can down the road and flee back when things will be messy. Make no mistake, we welcome everybody, but we must have some order.” He opined.

During the launch, the Association’s President Zhang Jiaping said the association has been established as a platform that will act as a bridge to serve society and benefit humanity. Zhang said the association will act per government approvals and construct according to approved drawings. At the same time, he noted that the association will seek to protect the rights and interests of property owners.

At the backdrop of all this, one of the leaders in the association has been doing the opposite of what’s they’re saying and promising.

To elaborate that the association is not as ‘harmless’ and seeks to only do good things, Ms Seii who is also a leader of Kilimani Estate residents association, exposed how Alina Valley Company Ltd, a company associated with Mr. Jack Wu as the Managing Director. Mr. Wu also happens to be the Vice Chair of the Chinese Property Developers Association.

It emerges that the company has allegedly been frustrating the residents

of Kilimani by putting up a structure contrary to the laid rules of the estate.

Anatomy of Corruption

April 2022: Alina Valley Company Ltd. begins to mobilise heavy duty machinery on a 1 acre plot on Likoni Lane to build 3 blocks of 17 storey apartments. They have no County Approvals, NEMA or NCA Licences. The residents are up in arms and block the road, forcing the developer to demobilise.

Residents demand that public participation is carried out. Alina attempts to carry out a sham public participation, where the Kenyan architect presents drawings labelled Chinese. The residents reject the project and ask the developer to go back to the drawing board and revise the drawings to meet the zoning guidelines and present them in English.

Alina returns and tries to forcefully carry public participation without giving the necessary notices and in the rain to discourage the residents from participating. The residents reject this and send the developer away.

Alina mysteriously gets approvals from the County without any public participation. The residents engage the Physical Planning Department to interrogate how this can be possible. The County duly ignores the residents.

Alina then submits an EIA report to NEMA to apply for a licence. The residents engage NEMA and submit a comprehensive counter report outlining the unsuitability of the site for such a high- impact project.

Because the report by the residents makes sense, Alina decides to cancel the NEMA Licence application and begin the process all over again as advised by some NEMA insiders.

Alina once again attempts to force public participation to tick a box in meeting the legal NEMA requirements by hiring goons to attend the meeting and intimidate the residents, some who even threatened the lives of the residents. This is reported to NEMA and the County.

The County suspends all the approvals they had granted to the developer on account of the above.

The developer submits a fresh EIA report to NEMA, without any public

participation. The residents counter this with a comprehensive report and signed petitions, with evidence of intimidation by the developer. NEMA disregards all of the above and grants the developer a licence.

Apropos of nothing, the Chinese Property Developers Association pays a visit to State House and meets with the First Lady, giving a donation of 100 water tanks and 10,000 tonnes of maize. (This often seen as a gesture of asking for favors).

The donations

In early January 2024, the Chinese Property Developers Association visits Governor Sakaja. The very next day, the suspended

approvals for Alina Valley by the County are ‘mysteriously’ reinstated, and the NCA also grants them a licence in a record 24 hrs.

January 16, 2024, construction begins with earnest on the site. The narrow roads on Likoni Lane are unable to accommodate the construction trucks and machinery, so the roads are blocked by the trucks and the residents cannot access their homes. All this had been highlighted to NEMA in the report submitted by the residents, but fell on deaf ears as envelopes changed hands.

But one wonders how they can be able to pull off such projects.

They will invite you to fill in some questionnaires (and probably pad them with cooked responses). And then they will invite you to attend a public participation meeting. They will set it on a weekday and with less than a 14 day notice. You will object

– because who wants 18 storeys built beacon to beacon next to them?

They will go away. Regroup. Go back to the County. Cook their EIA (usually written by someone from NEMA) and submit it to NEMA. Get their approvals at lightning speed.

Prior to That:

Scavenge for leasehold properties whose leases are coming to an end (preferably with elderly or deceased owners). OR prey on those who properties are so devalued through being surrounded by high rise buildings (also build by said Chinese). OR dupe some non-forward thinking individual into a JV using his/her land. Import their architectural plans directly from China; written in Mandarin – not for our ease of reference. Find a local architect (usually not a very seasoned professional) to register/localise the plan.

Find their local fixers who are usually a combination of Chinese nationals (now Kenyan citizens) who are now called Aaron, Jack, etc, who work with a couple of Kenyans who are either the thuggish type or those who drive around in big vehicles wearing Gucci and entice neighbours and associations to receive “compensation” for what they are about to do. One such lady approached us on Ndemi Road and it was clear that her Mandarin was better than her English or even Kiswahili.

Look for the rogue-est of rogue salvagers/excavators who know how to “deal” with the locals.

Descend on the County, NEMA and all the usual suspects that need softening and all manner of inducements.

Pretend to tick boxes knowing full well that their “development” is already a fait accompli.

Ms Jerotich says the Kilimani case is not isolated, “this story is almost identical everywhere you go in Kilimani and beyond. How Nairobi City County and NEMA have turned against Nairobians is incredible. The Chinese Property Developers Association believes that by repackaging themselves; running to State House; giving donations; and then running to Governor Sakaja, they are above the law and the wishes of Kenyans. They are counting on our silence as they continue their demarche.”

She adds, “We speak up now or forever hold our peace. This is not just about Kilimani. This is about the Nairobi We Want for future generations and the Chinese Property Developers Association can only but contributes to a dystopian future because they have been allowed to run amok.”
