It's always notable because of what it represents: new faces, new hope, a new start.

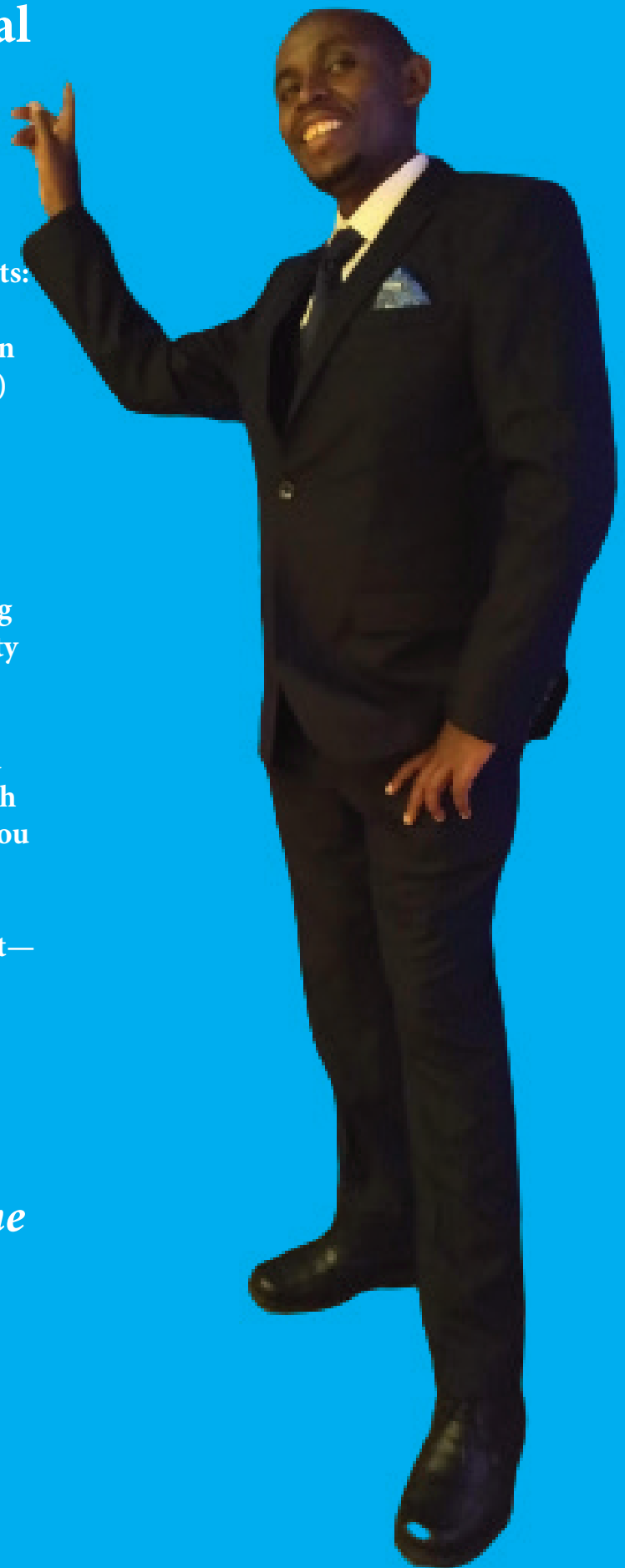

This experience taught me that both aloneness and teamwork have their own strengths. Soldiers, sports teams, and scientific missions like Chandrayaan-3 are examples of powerful teamwork. Similarly, herds of animals and colonies of insects show nature's reliance on collaboration. Yet, the strength of an individual lies in their ability to stand alone when needed.

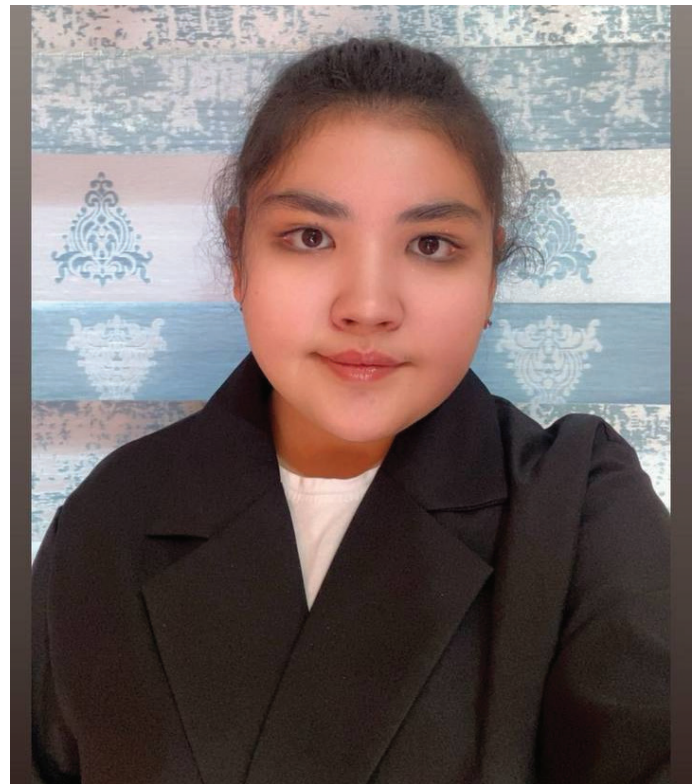
